Hello Sandy City Council Member Cyndi Sharkey -

Thank you for being willing to receive emails regarding this drastic change in city services.

One of the biggest reasons we helped our neighborhood annex into Sandy City was because of the curbside bulk waste program. Sandy had the greatest bulk waste program in the Salt Lake valley which encouraged the citizens to clean up their yards and beautify the city as a whole.

I know this may fall on deaf ears because the new program is already being implemented. Legally the Mayor can make these type of decisions on his own, but it is bad policy to do it without consulting the city council for a vote or allowing citizens to comment.

As Mayor Bradburn said, he wants to "keep the service level as high as they are or higher" and that this new program will "provide an even higher value to our residence but do it at a lower cost". When I first heard the presentation, I came away thinking that this would be a decent and fair alternative. But as I researched it further, I realized that the numbers disagree with both statements made by the Mayor.

Who can use this new service? It was indicated that each household can rent a dumpster for a 3 day period for free up to two times during the 6 months, but that is physically an impossible task. With only 20 containers used during 26 weeks of service, and 2 pickup/drop-offs possible a week, that gives only 1,040 households a chance to reserve the container. With approximately 30,722 households in Sandy, this means that only 3.4% of the houses in Sandy can utilize this service only ONCE a year. I understand that the dumpsters are large (30-yard) and multiple neighbors can share, but assuming you can maybe get 5 to 7 neighbors to share, you are still only providing the bulk waste service to less than 25% of the citizens. And this is <u>only</u> if the containers are constantly moving without any downtime between drop-offs during the entire 6 months.

This new program has gone from an awesome service that 100% of the population can enjoy to a sub-standard one that less than 25% of the population can utilize. With more than a 75% decrease in service usage and only a 32% decrease in cost, the cost per household served has increased from \$37/house to \$733/dumpster. Just the contractor cost alone for each dumpster is \$497/drop-off, where Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District offers this service for only \$145 a dumpster.

Other than the quantity of dumpsters available, the biggest issue is the size of the dumpster selected. 30-yard dumpsters are 22' long x 8' wide x 6' tall. They are difficult to safely get items into, especially for the elderly and anything heavy or bulky. After measuring my front yard, I can't legally get a dumpster of that size positioned anywhere. A 22' long dumpster would fit in front of my yard, but it will either encroach into the mandatory USPS mailbox minimum 10' clearance zone or hang over into my neighbor's driveway. I know that the USPS will leave warnings and not deliver mail because of recent experiences with dumpsters/work trucks in that location. Another issue with having only one dumpster is that there is no longer the option to segregate the Green Waste from the Bulk Waste. Everything goes to the dump.

I understand why citizens have complained during the bulk waste pickup, but the real issue is that certain citizens are not following the instructions provided with the program mailer. Putting out garbage the week before pickup and making piles no larger the 4' tall x 4' wide are two of the first instructions listed on the mailer. If people followed these two items, there wouldn't be any complaints regarding "Months of garbage on the street" and "Unsafe piles". Instead of basically removing the service, why not fine the egregious offenders.

Going from one of the best services in the valley to not providing a service for 75% of the community is a large jump. It's too bad Mayor Bradburn didn't follow good policy procedures and discuss this with the city council and allow citizen comments. I bet a better compromise somewhere in the middle ground could've been reached which would better serve the community and still reduce the cost.

Hello Sandy City Council Member Cyndi Sharkey -

Thank you for being willing to receive emails regarding this drastic change in city services.

One of the biggest reasons we helped our neighborhood annex into Sandy City was because of the curbside bulk waste program. Sandy had the greatest bulk waste program in the Salt Lake valley which encouraged the citizens to clean up their yards and beautify the city as a whole.

I know this may fall on deaf ears because the new program is already being implemented. Legally the Mayor can make these type of decisions on his own, but it is bad policy to do it without consulting the city council for a vote or allowing citizens to comment.

As Mayor Bradburn said, he wants to "keep the service level as high as they are or higher" and that this new program will "provide an even higher value to our residence but do it at a lower cost". When I first heard the presentation, I came away thinking that this would be a decent and fair alternative. But as I researched it further, I realized that the numbers disagree with both statements made by the Mayor.

Who can use this new service? It was indicated that each household can rent a dumpster for a 3 day period for free up to two times during the 6 months, but that is physically an impossible task. With only 20 containers used during 26 weeks of service, and 2 pickup/drop-offs possible a week, that gives only 1,040 households a chance to reserve the container. With approximately 30,722 households in Sandy, this means that only 3.4% of the houses in Sandy can utilize this service only ONCE a year. I understand that the dumpsters are large (30-yard) and multiple neighbors can share, but assuming you can maybe get 5 to 7 neighbors to share, you are still only providing the bulk waste service to less than 25% of the citizens. And this is <u>only</u> if the containers are constantly moving without any downtime between drop-offs during the entire 6 months.

This new program has gone from an awesome service that 100% of the population can enjoy to a sub-standard one that less than 25% of the population can utilize. With more than a 75% decrease in service usage and only a 32% decrease in cost, the cost per household served has increased from \$37/house to \$733/dumpster. Just the contractor cost alone for each dumpster is \$497/drop-off, where Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District offers this service for only \$145 a dumpster.

Other than the quantity of dumpsters available, the biggest issue is the size of the dumpster selected. 30-yard dumpsters are 22' long x 8' wide x 6' tall. They are difficult to safely get items into, especially for the elderly and anything heavy or bulky. After measuring my front yard, I can't legally get a dumpster of that size positioned anywhere. A 22' long dumpster would fit in front of my yard, but it will either encroach into the mandatory USPS mailbox minimum 10' clearance zone or hang over into my neighbor's driveway. I know that the USPS will leave warnings and not deliver mail because of recent experiences with dumpsters/work trucks in that location. Another issue with having only one dumpster is that there is no longer the option to segregate the Green Waste from the Bulk Waste. Everything goes to the dump.

I understand why citizens have complained during the bulk waste pickup, but the real issue is that certain citizens are not following the instructions provided with the program mailer. Putting out garbage the week before pickup and making piles no larger the 4' tall x 4' wide are two of the first instructions listed on the mailer. If people followed these two items, there wouldn't be any complaints regarding "Months of garbage on the street" and "Unsafe piles". Instead of basically removing the service, why not fine the egregious offenders.

Going from one of the best services in the valley to not providing a service for 75% of the community is a large jump. It's too bad Mayor Bradburn didn't follow good policy procedures and discuss this with the city council and allow citizen comments. I bet a better compromise somewhere in the middle ground could've been reached which would better serve the community and still reduce the cost.

Hello Sandy City Council Member Cyndi Sharkey -

Thank you for being willing to receive emails regarding this drastic change in city services.

One of the biggest reasons we helped our neighborhood annex into Sandy City was because of the curbside bulk waste program. Sandy had the greatest bulk waste program in the Salt Lake valley which encouraged the citizens to clean up their yards and beautify the city as a whole.

I know this may fall on deaf ears because the new program is already being implemented. Legally the Mayor can make these type of decisions on his own, but it is bad policy to do it without consulting the city council for a vote or allowing citizens to comment.

As Mayor Bradburn said, he wants to "keep the service level as high as they are or higher" and that this new program will "provide an even higher value to our residence but do it at a lower cost". When I first heard the presentation, I came away thinking that this would be a decent and fair alternative. But as I researched it further, I realized that the numbers disagree with both statements made by the Mayor.

Who can use this new service? It was indicated that each household can rent a dumpster for a 3 day period for free up to two times during the 6 months, but that is physically an impossible task. With only 20 containers used during 26 weeks of service, and 2 pickup/drop-offs possible a week, that gives only 1,040 households a chance to reserve the container. With approximately 30,722 households in Sandy, this means that only 3.4% of the houses in Sandy can utilize this service only ONCE a year. I understand that the dumpsters are large (30-yard) and multiple neighbors can share, but assuming you can maybe get 5 to 7 neighbors to share, you are still only providing the bulk waste service to less than 25% of the citizens. And this is <u>only</u> if the containers are constantly moving without any downtime between drop-offs during the entire 6 months.

This new program has gone from an awesome service that 100% of the population can enjoy to a sub-standard one that less than 25% of the population can utilize. With more than a 75% decrease in service usage and only a 32% decrease in cost, the cost per household served has increased from \$37/house to \$733/dumpster. Just the contractor cost alone for each dumpster is \$497/drop-off, where Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District offers this service for only \$145 a dumpster.

Other than the quantity of dumpsters available, the biggest issue is the size of the dumpster selected. 30-yard dumpsters are 22' long x 8' wide x 6' tall. They are difficult to safely get items into, especially for the elderly and anything heavy or bulky. After measuring my front yard, I can't legally get a dumpster of that size positioned anywhere. A 22' long dumpster would fit in front of my yard, but it will either encroach into the mandatory USPS mailbox minimum 10' clearance zone or hang over into my neighbor's driveway. I know that the USPS will leave warnings and not deliver mail because of recent experiences with dumpsters/work trucks in that location. Another issue with having only one dumpster is that there is no longer the option to segregate the Green Waste from the Bulk Waste. Everything goes to the dump.

I understand why citizens have complained during the bulk waste pickup, but the real issue is that certain citizens are not following the instructions provided with the program mailer. Putting out garbage the week before pickup and making piles no larger the 4' tall x 4' wide are two of the first instructions listed on the mailer. If people followed these two items, there wouldn't be any complaints regarding "Months of garbage on the street" and "Unsafe piles". Instead of basically removing the service, why not fine the egregious offenders.

Going from one of the best services in the valley to not providing a service for 75% of the community is a large jump. It's too bad Mayor Bradburn didn't follow good policy procedures and discuss this with the city council and allow citizen comments. I bet a better compromise somewhere in the middle ground could've been reached which would better serve the community and still reduce the cost.

Hello Sandy City Council Member Cyndi Sharkey -

Thank you for being willing to receive emails regarding this drastic change in city services.

One of the biggest reasons we helped our neighborhood annex into Sandy City was because of the curbside bulk waste program. Sandy had the greatest bulk waste program in the Salt Lake valley which encouraged the citizens to clean up their yards and beautify the city as a whole.

I know this may fall on deaf ears because the new program is already being implemented. Legally the Mayor can make these type of decisions on his own, but it is bad policy to do it without consulting the city council for a vote or allowing citizens to comment.

As Mayor Bradburn said, he wants to "keep the service level as high as they are or higher" and that this new program will "provide an even higher value to our residence but do it at a lower cost". When I first heard the presentation, I came away thinking that this would be a decent and fair alternative. But as I researched it further, I realized that the numbers disagree with both statements made by the Mayor.

Who can use this new service? It was indicated that each household can rent a dumpster for a 3 day period for free up to two times during the 6 months, but that is physically an impossible task. With only 20 containers used during 26 weeks of service, and 2 pickup/drop-offs possible a week, that gives only 1,040 households a chance to reserve the container. With approximately 30,722 households in Sandy, this means that only 3.4% of the houses in Sandy can utilize this service only ONCE a year. I understand that the dumpsters are large (30-yard) and multiple neighbors can share, but assuming you can maybe get 5 to 7 neighbors to share, you are still only providing the bulk waste service to less than 25% of the citizens. And this is <u>only</u> if the containers are constantly moving without any downtime between drop-offs during the entire 6 months.

This new program has gone from an awesome service that 100% of the population can enjoy to a sub-standard one that less than 25% of the population can utilize. With more than a 75% decrease in service usage and only a 32% decrease in cost, the cost per household served has increased from \$37/house to \$733/dumpster. Just the contractor cost alone for each dumpster is \$497/drop-off, where Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District offers this service for only \$145 a dumpster.

Other than the quantity of dumpsters available, the biggest issue is the size of the dumpster selected. 30-yard dumpsters are 22' long x 8' wide x 6' tall. They are difficult to safely get items into, especially for the elderly and anything heavy or bulky. After measuring my front yard, I can't legally get a dumpster of that size positioned anywhere. A 22' long dumpster would fit in front of my yard, but it will either encroach into the mandatory USPS mailbox minimum 10' clearance zone or hang over into my neighbor's driveway. I know that the USPS will leave warnings and not deliver mail because of recent experiences with dumpsters/work trucks in that location. Another issue with having only one dumpster is that there is no longer the option to segregate the Green Waste from the Bulk Waste. Everything goes to the dump.

I understand why citizens have complained during the bulk waste pickup, but the real issue is that certain citizens are not following the instructions provided with the program mailer. Putting out garbage the week before pickup and making piles no larger the 4' tall x 4' wide are two of the first instructions listed on the mailer. If people followed these two items, there wouldn't be any complaints regarding "Months of garbage on the street" and "Unsafe piles". Instead of basically removing the service, why not fine the egregious offenders.

Going from one of the best services in the valley to not providing a service for 75% of the community is a large jump. It's too bad Mayor Bradburn didn't follow good policy procedures and discuss this with the city council and allow citizen comments. I bet a better compromise somewhere in the middle ground could've been reached which would better serve the community and still reduce the cost.

I'm writing to express concern over the Mayor's decision to end curbside trash pick up twice a year. I see logic in some of his reasons, and two free dumpsters a year would be great. My concern is that the amount of dumpsters is grossly inadequate for Sandy's population. It's my understanding there are only 20 dumpsters to serve 100,000+ people and over 25,000 residences! This means a few hundred people can get a dumpster in the time the dumpsters are available. Even with neighbors sharing a dumpster, there's no way every resident will even have access to one shared dumpster, let alone reserve two dumpsters for their own personal use. This plan is in great need of re-evaluation.

Another concern I have is the way in which this decision was made--in a unilateral manner with no input from residents, and little communication. People have already started collecting garbage in anticipation of clean up this spring, storing piles on the sides of their homes and in other places. I imagine some residents will find ways to dispose of large garbage on their own, but others will not. As garbage collects and cleanup never comes, neighborhoods will decline along with property values. I imagine when these residents realize curbside pickup is discontinued, all of the dumpsters for the year will be reserved. Then what? It seems unwise to suddenly and completely discontinue a program residents have relied on for years.

Hello Sandy City Council Member Cyndi Sharkey -

Thank you for being willing to receive emails regarding this drastic change in city services.

One of the biggest reasons we helped our neighborhood annex into Sandy City was because of the curbside bulk waste program. Sandy had the greatest bulk waste program in the Salt Lake valley which encouraged the citizens to clean up their yards and beautify the city as a whole.

I know this may fall on deaf ears because the new program is already being implemented. Legally the Mayor can make these type of decisions on his own, but it is bad policy to do it without consulting the city council for a vote or allowing citizens to comment.

As Mayor Bradburn said, he wants to "keep the service level as high as they are or higher" and that this new program will "provide an even higher value to our residence but do it at a lower cost". When I first heard the presentation, I came away thinking that this would be a decent and fair alternative. But as I researched it further, I realized that the numbers disagree with both statements made by the Mayor.

Who can use this new service? It was indicated that each household can rent a dumpster for a 3 day period for free up to two times during the 6 months, but that is physically an impossible task. With only 20 containers used during 26 weeks of service, and 2 pickup/drop-offs possible a week, that gives only 1,040 households a chance to reserve the container. With approximately 30,722 households in Sandy, this means that only 3.4% of the houses in Sandy can utilize this service only ONCE a year. I understand that the dumpsters are large (30-yard) and multiple neighbors can share, but assuming you can maybe get 5 to 7 neighbors to share, you are still only providing the bulk waste service to less than 25% of the citizens. And this is <u>only</u> if the containers are constantly moving without any downtime between drop-offs during the entire 6 months.

This new program has gone from an awesome service that 100% of the population can enjoy to a sub-standard one that less than 25% of the population can utilize. With more than a 75% decrease in service usage and only a 32% decrease in cost, the cost per household served has increased from \$37/house to \$733/dumpster. Just the contractor cost alone for each dumpster is \$497/drop-off, where Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District offers this service for only \$145 a dumpster.

Other than the quantity of dumpsters available, the biggest issue is the size of the dumpster selected. 30-yard dumpsters are 22' long x 8' wide x 6' tall. They are difficult to safely get items into, especially for the elderly and anything heavy or bulky. After measuring my front yard, I can't legally get a dumpster of that size positioned anywhere. A 22' long dumpster would fit in front of my yard, but it will either encroach into the mandatory USPS mailbox minimum 10' clearance zone or hang over into my neighbor's driveway. I know that the USPS will leave warnings and not deliver mail because of recent experiences with dumpsters/work trucks in that location. Another issue with having only one dumpster is that there is no longer the option to segregate the Green Waste from the Bulk Waste. Everything goes to the dump.

I understand why citizens have complained during the bulk waste pickup, but the real issue is that certain citizens are not following the instructions provided with the program mailer. Putting out garbage the week before pickup and making piles no larger the 4' tall x 4' wide are two of the first instructions listed on the mailer. If people followed these two items, there wouldn't be any complaints regarding "Months of garbage on the street" and "Unsafe piles". Instead of basically removing the service, why not fine the egregious offenders.

Going from one of the best services in the valley to not providing a service for 75% of the community is a large jump. It's too bad Mayor Bradburn didn't follow good policy procedures and discuss this with the city council and allow citizen comments. I bet a better compromise somewhere in the middle ground could've been reached which would better serve the community and still reduce the cost.

Hello Sandy City Council Member Cyndi Sharkey -

Thank you for being willing to receive emails regarding this drastic change in city services.

One of the biggest reasons we helped our neighborhood annex into Sandy City was because of the curbside bulk waste program. Sandy had the greatest bulk waste program in the Salt Lake valley which encouraged the citizens to clean up their yards and beautify the city as a whole.

I know this may fall on deaf ears because the new program is already being implemented. Legally the Mayor can make these type of decisions on his own, but it is bad policy to do it without consulting the city council for a vote or allowing citizens to comment.

As Mayor Bradburn said, he wants to "keep the service level as high as they are or higher" and that this new program will "provide an even higher value to our residence but do it at a lower cost". When I first heard the presentation, I came away thinking that this would be a decent and fair alternative. But as I researched it further, I realized that the numbers disagree with both statements made by the Mayor.

Who can use this new service? It was indicated that each household can rent a dumpster for a 3 day period for free up to two times during the 6 months, but that is physically an impossible task. With only 20 containers used during 26 weeks of service, and 2 pickup/drop-offs possible a week, that gives only 1,040 households a chance to reserve the container. With approximately 30,722 households in Sandy, this means that only 3.4% of the houses in Sandy can utilize this service only ONCE a year. I understand that the dumpsters are large (30-yard) and multiple neighbors can share, but assuming you can maybe get 5 to 7 neighbors to share, you are still only providing the bulk waste service to less than 25% of the citizens. And this is <u>only</u> if the containers are constantly moving without any downtime between drop-offs during the entire 6 months.

This new program has gone from an awesome service that 100% of the population can enjoy to a sub-standard one that less than 25% of the population can utilize. With more than a 75% decrease in service usage and only a 32% decrease in cost, the cost per household served has increased from \$37/house to \$733/dumpster. Just the contractor cost alone for each dumpster is \$497/drop-off, where Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District offers this service for only \$145 a dumpster.

Other than the quantity of dumpsters available, the biggest issue is the size of the dumpster selected. 30-yard dumpsters are 22' long x 8' wide x 6' tall. They are difficult to safely get items into, especially for the elderly and anything heavy or bulky. After measuring my front yard, I can't legally get a dumpster of that size positioned anywhere. A 22' long dumpster would fit in front of my yard, but it will either encroach into the mandatory USPS mailbox minimum 10' clearance zone or hang over into my neighbor's driveway. I know that the USPS will leave warnings and not deliver mail because of recent experiences with dumpsters/work trucks in that location. Another issue with having only one dumpster is that there is no longer the option to segregate the Green Waste from the Bulk Waste. Everything goes to the dump.

I understand why citizens have complained during the bulk waste pickup, but the real issue is that certain citizens are not following the instructions provided with the program mailer. Putting out garbage the week before pickup and making piles no larger the 4' tall x 4' wide are two of the first instructions listed on the mailer. If people followed these two items, there wouldn't be any complaints regarding "Months of garbage on the street" and "Unsafe piles". Instead of basically removing the service, why not fine the egregious offenders.

Going from one of the best services in the valley to not providing a service for 75% of the community is a large jump. It's too bad Mayor Bradburn didn't follow good policy procedures and discuss this with the city council and allow citizen comments. I bet a better compromise somewhere in the middle ground could've been reached which would better serve the community and still reduce the cost.

I believe that if we have to wait many months to even a year for a dumpster we will see our neighbor hoods becoming more trashy, as we wait for a dumpster. Yes, please do.

I saw the citizen comments about how some people are opposed to be bulk trash pickup because the curbside piles create an eyesore. Well, in my neighborhood the curbside piles appear anywhere from a week to a few days before pickup. I don't mind that people start putting things out on the curb. At least it means that they're not putting big piles of junk in their yards that just stay there. The city has been really good to pickup on the days that they designate, and the piles disappear.

We do have some people who drive around looking for the curbside piles, and they pick through the debris to remove recyclable metals, etc. I thought that it was against city law, but they do it anyway. Last bulk pickup we had at least two of those pickup with trailer pickers. The objections to the 'piles' seem to be in the minority. The dumpster idea...I don't like because there is a potential for having a dumpster in my culdesac for some unspecified time. When the neighbors put their debris piles at the curbside, at least I can drive through the street and get into my driveway. And I know exactly when to put out stuff and when the city will remove it. It looks like the dumpster could sit for 60 hours or more...and that just depends upon if Waste Management is on top of the placement and removal. I'm not prepared to have a dumpster in my neighborhood for more than the time they allot. And then it becomes a problem for me to keep contacting someone to come get the stuff. Call me a pessimist, but at some point, I foresee a charge for this service coming from Waste Management...once they figure out the demand and the sporadic placement and retrieval possibilities. If the city wants to do this, it seems to me that the most efficient way to implement this is to get dumpsters scheduled for neighborhoods so that they are placed and removed in an organized manner. The point is keeping the city cleaned up and houses attractive to residents and potential buyers. If the dumpster idea starts becoming a 'hassle', the city is likely to find their demand for additional trashcans increased, and the debris from yard cleanup and other disposals included in curbside trash...or alternatively, piled in yards as an eyesore.

And if you ask me, the list of prohibited items won't stop someone from putting them in a dumpster in a neighborhood. So what happens then... if I reserve a dumpster and someone in

Let me just say that I don't believe the dumpster idea isn't a very good one. The idea that the city would have some dumpsters sitting on the streets for who knows how long creates a nuisance for residents, as well as the opportunity for rain water, dirt or other debris to collect in an open dumpster left out. While the city has been good about setting rules for bulk pickup, I see some of my neighbors including stuff that was not supposed to be removed. The city still picked up the stuff when someone wasn't following the instructions. Shocking, I know... I'm writing in support of keeping the bulk waste program alive in Sandy.

I grew up in SLC and the annual cleanup was a big deal. Our neighborhood benefitted tremendously from the program. My parents still live there and are very concerned about how they are going to dispose of yard waste, etc. without the program in place moving forward.

I've lived in a number of different cities both in Utah and elsewhere. One of the reasons I chose to live in Sandy when we moved back to the Valley is because the city does such a great job with streets, parks, roads, etc. and because of the bulk waste program that motivates and allows residents to take responsibility for keeping their yards in good repair.

When you don't have a program like this in place, only those with pickup trucks, large trailers, or lots of disposable income to hire someone else who does are able to take care of yard projects, trimming bushes, removing tree limbs, etc. The natural outcome is that people basically stop caring for their yards and let more and more grow wild. They don't have a way to get limbs and such hauled away, so they don't trim them.

In our neighborhood we have lots of long-time homeowners who are getting up there in years. None of them have a means of hauling away yard waste. We also have a good group of able-bodied neighbors with chainsaws, rakes, trimmers, and more who are willing to move around the neighborhood helping these older neighbors. We gather together twice a year as a neighborhood and find the neighbors most in need of help and step in to help them clear out and trim back the growth. This happens the Saturday before our neighborhood pickup. It brings our neighborhood together and is one of the more charming parts of living here. Without the bulk waste program, I'm not sure how we'd do this. While we have sufficiently able-bodied men to help their neighbors, few, if any, have trucks, trailers, etc. that we could use to efficiently haul away the yard waste.

One more issue is that our solid waste program doesn't have a viable yard waste solution either. We already have a recycling program (that doesn't accept most recyclables). But we have to dispose of yard waste together with other solid waste. For most people, that isn't nearly enough space for disposing of normal trash, recyclable trash that can't be recycled, AND yard waste. Increasing the amount of yard waste by discontinuing the bulk waste pickup would further strain the system. Adding yard waste specific containers would be a pain (one more can to take to the curb each week and store the rest of the time), and would

likely increase costs by adding a third truck route each week city wide to handle those containers as well. The bulk waste program must be more efficient than that.

You are welcome. I do try to stay informed. I miss a lot, but do try. I didn't know you had asked for feedback on the bulk waste. I (of course) live in District 4. I did see that Council Member Zoltanski asked on her Facebook account for feedback on the bulk waste and I posted my comments this morning there. I was watching the livefeed of the City Council meeting that night and have been thinking it over. I don't mean to overwhelm you. I did go through the Agenda Packet for the City Council meeting and read all the emails submitted. I will include mine as mine are noticeably different than most. In the end, I am very conflicted as to how I feel about the program.

I'm really torn on this. I see what people put out and the way we treat our storm drain is inexcusable. Sandy City ALWAYS does a fantastic job notifying citizens as to what can and cannot be put out. We separate green waste from the rest. We never put out tires or construction material or other hazardous waste. That being said, it doesn't seem like a chunk of our citizens bother and just toss stuff out. I cannot imagine how much goes down the drain.

Second, I never thought about the safety of Public Works employees. Having a husband that works a dangerous job, I have great empathy for these employees and their families. To me, nothing is more important than keeping those guys and gals safe. 1.3 million hours without an accident is something that should be celebrated. I would also like to add, that the crews have always been amazing. They are incredibly mindful at all times, both with property, but also all movement around them both traffic and pedestrians, and that in itself speaks volumes about the entire department. They always leave the front of our house tidy and in the past, we have had some massive piles.

Third, I understand the importance of cost savings. That is a lot of money and resources could be better spent.

On the flip side, there are lots of reasons I love the bulk waste program. One of them I am certainly in the minority view on.

First of all, I don't appreciate the short notice. I, along with numerous neighbors, have been holding on to things in anticipation of spring clean up. I think at least six month notice should have been given.

Also, my street really uses the bulk program pick up. We have the larger lots and we have heavily relied on the bulk pick up in the past. When we moved in, our house and property had fallen into disarray after a decade of the previous homeowner being ill. We used the street for our old cabinets and waaaaaaaaaay too much green waste to even explain. There were numerous pick-ups where one corner of our property to the other on the street was just green waste. I feel with some of the larger lots and the amount of green waste they generate, the bulk pick up was great at diverting from the landfill. However, I now understand that green waste is frequently sent to the landfill anyway as demand for it isn't as great as the supply. I wish there were a way to increase demand. (Off topic, but we love Chip Drop for the free woodchips including delivery we get. Between two loads in January, I bet we received forty cubic yards of woodchips. For free.)

Anyway, to my final reason why I actually grew to really like the bulk waste pick up. And likely one that is very unpopular. I liked the scrap guys (and even gals, thinking of the teenage girl we would see helping her dad) who come through. We would put things out specifically for them. We'd put our scrap metal out first, then wait for it to be grabbed by somebody, and then put out our other items. Right now we have a chunk of copper that I literally had my husband pull out of the trash can and I said, "Wait! Let's save that for the scrappers!"

I'm not going to name names, but I also know somebody who likes to go around and pull things from other people's piles. She has found AMAZING things. Last year she gifted me almost a full roll of welded wire that I put to use building deer proof cages for our fruit trees to keep the horde of deer from killing them all. There was nothing wrong with it. She sometimes sends me pictures of her other treasures and, man, I cannot believe people throw away such awesome things. Things that just would have gone to the landfill.

I guess in conclusion, I worry about the perfectly good metal and other items that will now just go to the landfill. We never seem to have enough scrap metal to take it to a scrapper ourselves and the last time my husband did, he said he would never go back. Not due to the scrappers, but the other customers (meaning tweakers) that he ran into. Part of me wonders if the City could collect it, but I imagine there again would be liability as all metal is different and some people may abuse the system.

As for the other perfectly usable items that will now end up in dumpsters, I don't know what to do about that. Maybe citizens will go back to setting them out with a "free" sign, but in honestly, I think they will just go in dumpsters. Whenever people have gotten a dumpster (myself included), it just seems easier to put things in there than go throw the effort of finding it a good home.

I also wonder if twenty dumpsters is sufficient. I think of interstates. Building more lanes doesn't alleviate traffic issues, but leads to more traffic. I don't know, I just wonder if there are issues that will arise by switching over. When we used to live in Cottonwood Heights, they would put out dumpsters once a year. We'd be working and come home and one neighbor would have gone around to all the dumpsters and filled up the whole way around the block!

you must go online and reserve a dumpster for free. There are 20 dumpsters available to the 25,000+ residents. So pretty much it will be a joke trying to get one. The Council has asked the Mayor to bring his plan to the council meeting Tuesday night so they and the public can discuss, ask questions and comment. The first step to reversing this is getting residents to voice their opinion. You can either show up to the meeting or send an email no later than Tuesday afternoon (2/4) to csharkey@sandy.utah.gov with your feelings and opinions on the matter. Please pass this on to everyone you know in Sandy and let's do our best to get the sandy pickup back.

Dear Councilwoman Sharkey:

I was frustrated when I received an email last week from the city stating that the bulk waste pickup has been changed. As far as I can tell Sandy City Mayor Bradburn, without first consulting the City Council, has done a complete overhaul of the bulk pickup service the city has provided for many years. Additionally, I don't believe he asked for input from city residents before making these draconian changes. I'm part of a group that regularly provides feedback on issues the city is looking at (Dimple Dell usage, traffic flow around Rio Tinto Stadium, the empty land east of Albion Middle, street light issues, etc.). I received no email soliciting input regarding the bulk waste program.

I went to the city's website to read through the "new" bulk waste program. I discovered there are only 20 dumpsters that are available to reserve--a woefully inadequate number for a city with 95,000+ residents. I further discovered that the individual who reserves the dumpster also assumes responsibility for whatever ends up in it. The problem with that is that the dumpster remains in front of your home for up to 60 hours. This means you ensure for that time period that no one puts stuff in the dumpster that's not allowed (like paint and other items specifically prohibited). The website doesn't specifically spell it out, but assuming responsibility for any prohibited items might mean either a fine will be imposed or

a bill will be sent for the cost the city incurs to dispose of the prohibited items.

Two of my children live in municipalities (Murray, Cottonwood Heights) that put dumpsters in different neighborhoods one or two times during the year. I regularly hear from them about how much they wish their cities provided the bulk waste pickup service that Sandy City does. Or did. They've complained it's difficult to get heavy items into the dumpsters, and that it creates issues between neighbors as a race occurs to see who can get their stuff in the dumpsters as quickly as possible before they fill up, and they fill up quickly. Based on the information they've shared over the years, it is a very real possibility that the situation could arise where neighbors, who haven't been invited to put their stuff in a dumpster someone else has reserved, might look for an opportunity to put their stuff in the dumpster at a time when other neighbors aren't around. I also believe, given there are only 20 dumpsters for Sandy's new program, that this issue will be a big problem.

The Sandy City's website said complaints have been filed by city residents about the debris left on the streets after the bulk pickup, and that the streets look trashy before the pickup. But in my opinion, those issues are less problematic than (1) overhauling a popular city service without first going through the process of soliciting citizen input, (2) forcing individuals who rent the dumpsters to take responsibility for its contents when they don't have the ability to control what's put in an open dumpster left in front of their house over a 60-hour time period unless they have 24-hour surveillance in place, (3) the real possibility that others will put their waste in the dumpsters uninvited, and (4) providing an inadequate number of dumpsters to be reserved which will result in a substantial decrease and change in what has been a popular city service.

Frankly, the changes Mayor Bradburn has put in place are even inferior to what our children in Murray and Cottonwood Heights enjoy. At least those municipalities provide the dumpsters on a regular basis without having to reserve them, and individual citizens don't have to assume the liability of what their neighbors might put in the dumpsters.

Please do all you can to dial back this change. While changes to the current program might be needed, making those changes without discussion with the city council and solicitation of input from the citizenry is not good policy.

After reviewing the Dumpster Program, we still feel that the Curb Collection is still a better option. Reasons are as follows:

- 1) It actually forces the whole neighborhood to clean up as there is a specific date that you have to have your waste product on the curb ready for pick-up.
- 2) The scavengers come through and take anything that is recyclable. They are going to do this whether the materials are on the curb or in a dumpster. Do you really want to have people or kids crawling around in City owned dumpsters with the possibility of getting injured and then having to call in the First Responders? Seems like a lot of liability.
- 3) 20 dumpsters for the whole city is not many. Especially on a first come first serve basis. It will limit the home owners to just one clean-up per year. We really need 2. It is amazing how much junk you acquire throughout the year.
- 4) Many homeowners will probably not even take advantage of it due to the fact that they do not have a lot of waste materials. They will just let it pile up in their backyards thinking that they will get rid of it at some time. That will bring in mice, rats, snakes and possibly skunks. I have just been informed there will be no Spring or Fall bulk waste pickup that has been available in past years. Curb-side pickup has been much appreciated and a real plus for Sandy residence. I understand that the trash trollies will be used instead (by reservation). I am dismayed by what seems to be a reduction in the benefits offered to Sandy citizens and would like you to know that I would appreciate anything you can do to see that the curb-side service is continued.

We have always complied fully with the time schedule and types of materials we could place at curb side. I am aware that some Sandy citizens have abused this privilege by placing items too early and by including items not approved for pickup. These abuses could be handled in a better way than making the change to the trash trollies. They should simply be fined or charged the going rate for the dump fees and transportation.

The immediate problem for us is that we live on a cul-de-sac. There is no place we can place a trash trolley without blocking driveways and mail boxes. Also, by eliminating the bulk waste pickup, Sandy can expect to have more leaves and Fall trash in the storm drains. Also, by scheduling two pickups, people get busy cleaning up their yards at least twice a year. Without this benefit, people are likely to allow debris to accumulate in their yards.
