#### **MEMORANDUM**

Subject: Stroud Alternative Proposal to Fund Capital Facilities

Fellow Councilmembers, below you'll find my proposal for a concept that will fund many of our critical capital facility needs, without pitting one against the other. In this proposal I'm focusing on a high-level concept. Should the Council decide to move forward with this concept, we will need to flesh out some of the details, either this evening or during a future meeting.

#### Concept in brief:

The City will use all capital reserves, all available impact fees, the sale of certain properties, the revenue from certain sunsetting bonds, and a combination of both Revenue and General Obligation Bonds to fund capital projects in the aggregate.

#### Relevant Utah Law:

In regards to the required ballot language mandatory for the issuance of a general obligation bond, Utah Code Annotated 11-14-206(2)(b-c) states:

- (b) The governing body may state the purpose of the bonds in general terms and need not specify the particular projects for which the governing body intends to issue the bonds or the specific amount of bond proceeds that the governing body intends to expend for each project.
- (c) If the governing body intends that the bonds be payable in part from tax proceeds and in part from the operating revenues of the local political subdivision, or from any combination of tax proceeds and operating revenues, the governing body may indicate those payment sources on the bond proposition, but need not specify how the governing body intends to divide the bonds between those sources of payment.

In regards to the timing of issuing General Obligation Bonds, Utah Code Annotated 11-14-301(2)(a) states:

(a) It is not necessary that all of the bonds be issued at one time, but, except as otherwise provided in this Subsection (2), bonds approved by the voters may not be issued more than 10 years after the day on which the election is held.

#### **Concept Outline:**

- 1. Identify the total estimated cost for all (or a portion of) capital projects on the Sandy City FY24 Consolidated Capital Projects Schedule (Exhibit "A").
  - a. Example: Sandy City has pending capital expenses of \$85 million in critical public safety, parks, and recreation infrastructure.
- 2. Identify the amount of funding that the city has available to put towards the pending capital expenses. This will be a combination of capital reserves, impact fees, and the sale of property (Exhibit "B").
  - a. Example: The City has \$20 million dollars available to fund these expenses...
- 3. Identify the funding gap.
  - a. Example: Resulting in a gap of \$65 million.
- 4. Identify the intention of the City.
  - a. Example: It is the intention of Sandy City to issue a general obligation bond to cover \$X million of this gap (the Council may choose to request the entire gap or only a portion of the gap, with the intention of funding one or two specific projects).
- 5. Use of sunsetting bond revenue is a failsafe should inflation or other factors result in a shortfall between available revenues and project costs. When needed, the available revenue from sunsetting bonds (about \$450 thousand annually) can be used to issue sales tax revenue bonds. In the current market, with a 20-year term, a \$450 thousand annual debt service payment would provide approximately \$6 million in proceeds to apply towards pending capital expenses.

#### <u>Proposed Draft Ballot Language:</u>

On May 2, 2023, the Administrative Services Department provided the Council with a draft resolution providing for a special bond election in 2023. The proposed language envisioned a bond that specifically funded the construction of a new Fire Station. I've included an amended draft of that resolution, expanding its scope, for Council consideration (Exhibit "C")

#### Request:

I'm requesting that the Council give formal direction to administrative staff to bring back a final version of the resolution in Exhibit "C" for council consideration no later than July 25, 2023. If the Council chooses to give that direction, then we will also need to discuss and determine the final details within the scope of the bond resolution (Exhibit "C").

Section 2. <u>Election Call</u>. Section 3. <u>Voting Places and Election Judges</u>. For purposes of the Bond Election, the voting methods, the voting precincts, the voting places, the election judges,

Section 7. Mailing of Voter Information Pamphlet. The Council hereby directs the City Recorder of Sandy City, Utah (the "City Recorder") to mail at least fifteen (15) but not more than forty-five (45) days before the scheduled Bond Election, a voter information pamphlet or a notice printed on a postage prepaid, preaddressed return form that a person may use to request delivery of a voter information pamphlet by mail, to each household with a registered voter who is eligible to vote on the Bonds. Section 9. <u>Election Supplies and Ballots</u>. The ballots to be used at the Bond Election shall comply in all respects with the requirements of the Act at the time of the Bond Election, including, but not limited to, Title 20A, Chapter 6 and Section 11-14-206 of the Act, and the proposition and election instructions with respect to the Bond Election shall be in substantially the form contained in the Election Notice set forth in Section 6 hereof.

Section 10. <u>Appointment of Election Officers</u>. Pursuant to Sections 20A-1-102 and 20A-5-400.5 of the Act, the County Clerk of Salt Lake County and the City Recorder will act as election officers (the "Election Officers"). Section 13. <u>Conflict</u>. All resolutions, orders, and regulations or parts thereof heretofore adopted or passed which are in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed. This repealer shall not be construed so as to revive any resolution, order, regulation, or part thereof heretofore repealed.

Section 14. <u>Captions</u>. The headings herein are for convenience of reference only and in no way define, limit, or describe the scope or intent of any provisions or sections of this resolution.

Section 15. <u>Recording of Resolution; Effective Date; Notice to Lieutenant Governor and Election Officers</u>. Immediately after its adoption, this Resolution shall be signed by the Mayor and City Recorder, shall be recorded in a book for that purpose, and shall take immediate effect. The City Recorder shall immediately furnish a certified copy of this Resolution to the Lieutenant Governor and the Salt Lake County Clerk in

accordance with Section 11-14-201 of the Act by no later than August 24, 2023, a date at least 75 days before the Bond Election.

Section 16. <u>Further Authority</u>.
