

Ranked Choice Voting Survey Results

Methodology

- Utilized the Qualtrics Research Core Platform (used by fortune 100 companies like Microsoft and Goldman Sachs, and research firms like Y² Analytics, and public sectors like the U.K. Post Office)
- Responses can be collected via one-to-one emails (Citizen Connect Panel) or an anonymous link
- One-to-one emails cannot be forwarded
- With an anonymous link, measures can be taken to prevent respondents from taking a survey more than once, but this can be circumvented by clearing cookies and/or switching browsers/devices

Survey Data


- 2,579 total responses collected from 12-2-21 to 12-21-21
- 711 or 28% from the Citizen Connect Panel (distributed via one-to-one emails)
- 1,868 or 72% from the Anonymous Link (distributed via social media, postcard, website, email & text)




Please select which council district you live in.









How did you hear about this survey? (Select all that apply)






How did you find the process of using Ranked Choice Voting?











Only those who answered somewhat or very difficult to the previous question answered the following question.

- Ranked choice is full of fraud and deception







All those who DID vote in the 2021 Sandy Municipal Election answered the following questions.








Did you rank more than one candidate on your ballot, for either the Mayor or Council elections?






Only those who ranked just one candidate answered the following question.

- Too many candidates


- It is not clear how 'secondary' votes would be used/counted

- Candidates did not identify party affiliation




Do you think Ranked Choice Voting should be used in future Sandy City Municipal elections?








From what source, if any, did you learn about Ranked Choice Voting? (Select all that apply)

Negative Comments


- Confusing, don't do it again

- Too many candidates






Only those who DID NOT vote in the 2021 Sandy Municipal Election answered the following questions.

Please select the reason you did not vote in the 2021 Sandy Municipal Election.








Answers Indicating Other


- I was late in sending in my ballot

Do you think Ranked Choice Voting should be used in future Sandy City Municipal elections?









From what source, if any, did you learn about Ranked Choice Voting? (Select all that apply)

Positive Comments

- RCV is not a free fair or legitimate election
- Too complicated



Survey Summary

- Most of the data broken out was comparable
- The biggest disparity between the Citizen Connect Panel and anonymous link was when respondents were asked about using RCV in the future
- Overwhelmingly for all respondents, the number 1 reason RCV was described as difficult is because there were too many candidates
- Best way to reach residents is via email or postcard
