How Waste Collection Is Financed

(1.) Waste fees are collected from residents and put in the Waste Fund to finance weekly pickup and the bulk waste program

(2.) Revenue is first allocated towards weekly pickup









(3.) Remaining revenue is allocated to the bulk waste program which is operated by city streets crews



(4.) Any excess revenue drops to the fund balance for future capital costs or revenue shortfalls





How Waste Collection Is Financed

(1.) Waste fees are collected from residents and put in the Waste Fund to finance weekly pickup and the bulk waste program

(2.) Revenue is first allocated towards weekly pickup






The General Fund subsidizes the program indirectly since it pays for most street crew salaries and vehicle maintenance costs for Public Works



(3.) Remaining revenue is allocated to the bulk waste program which is operated by city streets crews

Budget Considerations

- Currently, the Waste Fund and General Fund are both paying the costs of the bulk waste program
 - ➤ The General Fund indirectly subsidized the program by \$783,000 in FY 2020

- Budgeting for the entire cost of the program in the Waste Fund would provide more transparency
 - ➤ This modification will necessitate a General Fund transfer to the Waste Fund or an increase in waste collection fees
