Subject: Council Member Sharkey proposed amendment to the FY 2025 Tentative Budget –

Bulk Waste Subsidy and Fees

Description: Maintaining the General Fund subsidy transfer to the Bulk Waste Program.

Proposal Summary:

This amendment proposes to maintain the \$575,000 subsidy from the General Fund for the Bulk Waste Program. This program is highly valued throughout Sandy City and facilitates the disposal of items that cannot be managed through weekly waste collection services. In the tentative budget, the Mayor's introductory memo states "The Bulk Waste Program is an appreciated benefit for Sandy City residents, and the General Fund has subsidized it since the city began offering it." My intention is to continue this long-standing tradition as an affordable benefit for Sandy's residents.

As established, for most of its 40+ year existence, much of the Bulk Waste Program's funding came from the General Fund. Two years ago, a Bulk Waste Environmental Fee was implemented to cover the cost associated with heightened environmental requirements and enforcement needs. My intention is still to cover those costs and any inflationary cost increases with that fee. However, in keeping the subsidy to the program, we can keep the costs lower for our residents at a time when they have dealt with multiple tax and fee increases. We have asked so much of our residents over the past couple of years that we can surely make a sacrifice this year. The program's benefits in terms of city cleanliness, aesthetics, and resident satisfaction warrant financial support from the General Fund.

Detailed Proposed Expenditures (See Exhibits A & B):

General Fund – Transfers to Other Funds – 4415210 – City Cleanup \$575,000

Detailed Proposed Revenue Sources (See Exhibits A & B):



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The funding for the transfer will be sourced from a reduction in proposed expenditures in the FY2025 Tentative Budget from ongoing funding sources. The reductions in ongoing funding that were programmed for one-time purchases and fleet will be replenished by a reappropriation of one-time sources. Details of the funding mechanism can be found in Exhibits A (Flow Chart) and B (Budget Detail) to this memo.


Justification:

Sandy City residents overwhelmingly support the Bulk Waste Program, demonstrated by high participation rates and positive feedback. Given that our residents have been asked to bear the burden of multiple tax and fee increases over the past couple years, now is not the time to make an additional ask of our residents when we have the ability to dig deeper into our spending and find a way to cover the cost ourselves. I'm proposing that the city make the necessary adjustments for this fiscal year and preserve the subsidy. In maintaining a \$575,000 transfer from the General Fund we can continue to provide Bulk Waste service at the level our residents have come to expect and uphold the benefit of funding a significant portion of the program through the General Fund.

The Waste Management Contract Increase:

The Mayor's tentative budget proposes a \$4.20 bulk waste fee increase (from \$1.45 to \$5.65) that is derived from two sources: the elimination of the General Fund subsidy, and an increase in our contract with Waste Management equaling \$644,000. The city can't afford to absorb such a significant cost increase from our contractor under the current budget. Waste Management doesn't provide any services related to our bulk waste program, so the impact of the increase better fits with the weekly waste program. The increase per utility account is \$2.30 per month. This fee increase feels unavoidable, but I am open to good ideas! With consistency and transparency as my goal, any fee increase from Waste Management belongs on the weekly can fee, rather than elsewhere. Restoring the General Fund subsidy and applying the waste contract increase to the waste fee (\$2.30/month on the first can) would maintain the bulk waste environmental fee at \$1.45/month.

^{**} This is otherwise known as "one-time for ongoing," and includes ongoing monies set aside for one-time equipment purchases in the tentative budget.

Budget StrategiesWaste Collection Revenues

Waste Collection Funding Options - Fee Amounts

- Option A Revenue Sharing: increase base can fee or bulk waste fee by \$2.30
 - -Perpetuates lack of clarity in rate structure and program costs
- Monthly Base Can Fee
 - -Increases from \$15.95 to **\$18.75** (or remains at **\$15.95** if applied to bulk waste fee)
- Monthly Bulk Waste Fee
 - -Remains at \$1.45 (or increases to \$3.75 if monthly can fee remains the same)
- Annual General Fund Subsidy for Bulk Waste Program
 - -Remains at **\$575,000**
