Council Member Christensen spoke to budget option #3 attached to this agenda item.

A motion was made by Brooke Christensen, seconded by Zach Robinson, to amend the direction given last week that included items 2-5 of the Nicholl, Stroud, Houseman budget proposal to include an adjustment to the compensation package for 50% of the Public Safety Steps and 50% of the Market increase for all other employees starting on July 1, 2020. The remaining 50% of the compensation package would be put in place as soon as General Fund money is available or three months of revenue and expense, as set in the approved budget, is met.

Dustin Fratto gave instruction on how to address the Council on this proposal.

Cathy Spuck spoke in favor of the proposal.

Steve Van Maren expressed concern about the real cost to the budget, and believed the expenses could outspend revenue but thought it was a step in the right direction.

Ryan Bird, Fraternal Order of Police Vice President thanked the Council for being open to hearing from the FOP.

Council discussion followed.

There was a motion by Zach Robinson and seconded by Brooke Christensen to call the question. The motion carried by the following vote:
