TRCC City Reimbursment Agreement - Sandy City-Bicentennial Park

Dan Medina, Parks & Recreation, presented Director, presented Resolution 25-13C and an Interlocal Agreement (ILC) with Salt Lake County to receive funding through the Tourism, Recreation, Cultural, Convention, and Airport Facilities (TRCC). The grant award of \$700,000 will be used for park improvements to Bicentennial Park in Historic Sandy. This is an information item and will come back to the Council at a future council meeting for action.

### 2. <u>25-099</u> Economic Development Department Providing the City Council with Updates on Economic Development Projects and The Cairns Housing Transit Reinvestment Zone Proposal

#### Attachments: April 2025 Council Update

Kasey Dunlavy and Rob Sant, Economic Development, provided an update to the Council on Economic Development projects in Sandy City and the Cairns Housing Transit Reinvestment Zone proposal. Last year in Sandy City, there were over 700 new business licenses issued, 1,600 new jobs created, 3% unemployment and Sandy ranked in the top five cities for taxable sales of \$3.3 billion. They provided project overviews of the following developments: The Compass located at 9295 S 255 W; Sandy Shulsen project located at 10115 S Monroe Streeet; Centennial Village located at 215 W Sego Lily Drive; Redsky located at 10140 S Centennial Parkway; The Summit located at 10240 S Monroe Street; and the Utah Hockey Club located at 9835 S Monroe Street. They spoke about the Cairns Housing and Transit Reinvestment Zones (HRTZ), the key objectives and process. Council questions and comments followed.
