Program History

1. Began over 30 years ago.
2. Started as a spring community clean-up program
3. 1995 - program changed to a monthly pick up (failed)
4. 1998 - moved to the current spring and fall collection program.
5. Current bulk waste program hasn't changed for over 20 years.



Current Program Details

1. Entire Streets Division
 - a. 40 hours per week
 - b. 24 weeks a year (12 in spring, 12 in fall)
2. Loaders pick up debris and trucks cycle waste to landfill
 - a. Over 4,000 trips each year
3. Scheduling is weather/snow dependent
 - a. Spring: Start West to East
 - b. Fall: Start East to West
4. 2020 Fall Schedule:
 - a. September 14-November 19
 - b. Working four 10-hour shift days
 - c. Time sensitive projects are worked on Fridays as overtime



Staff Time

1. Streets Division – Authorized 28 Personnel (authorized 27 in 1990 before current program)
2. Personnel diverted from maintenance 24 weeks each year
3. On hold: All in-house road maintenance, concrete replacement, and tree trimming
4. Staff Concerns:
 - a. Prefer working on maintenance crews
 - b. Lack of citizen compliance
 - c. Safety



Equipment Usage and Related Costs

1. Loaders (2):

- a. O&M - \$4,550 each/yr.
- b. Replacement cost = \$130,000 each
- c. 12 yr. replacement

2. Leaf Trucks (5):

- a. O&M - \$17,380 each
- b. Replacement cost=\$150,000 each
- c. 10 yr. replacement

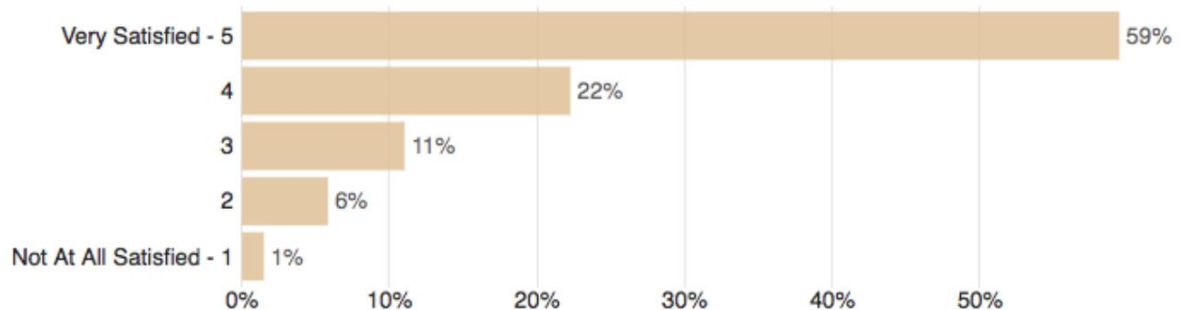
3. 10-Wheel Trucks (17):

- a. O&M - \$6,975
- b. Replacement cost=\$225,000 each
- c. 10 yr. replacement

2. 1040 Total Responses (52% response rate)

Bulk Waste Program Guidelines

[FALL 2020] *Scavenging is discouraged!*

FOR SANDY RESIDENTS ONLY

This service is not available to condos, mobile home parks or...

Items Sandy City **WILL NOT** pick up

1 Place bulk waste curbside no sooner than the Saturday prior to your **scheduled collection date** (noted on reverse side)* or no later than 7:00am on your scheduled date. Residents can be cited for items placed out too early.



2 Do not put waste on the parkstrip, against a fence, on top of a utility box or storm water inlet grate, or within 3 feet of a fire hydrant. **Put the pile in the street.**

3 Place all **GREEN WASTE** (branches, shrubs, wood) in one pile. Place all **OTHER TRASH** into a separate pile.



4 Don't park within 15 feet of either pile.



5 Loose materials (leaves, needles, chips, etc.) must be placed in a trash box.

6 Lawnmowers and other similar items must have the oil and gasoline removed.



7 55 gallon containers must be emptied and have either the tops removed or be cut in half.



8 All materials including tree limbs and stumps should be cut into 4 foot lengths and be no more than 18" in diameter.



9 If you hire a landscaper or contractor to do work at your home, they are responsible for removing and disposing all debris.



10

Lawnmowers and other similar items must have the oil and gasoline removed.

Items containing a refrigerant such as Freon (refrigerators, freezers, and air conditioners) must have the chemical removed by a professional and a copy of the receipt must be attached to it.

Vehicle parts, tires, or propane tanks are **not** accepted.

Do not put waste on the parkstrip, against a fence, on top of a utility box, against a fire hydrant, or on a storm water inlet grate. **Put the pile in the street.**



Bulk Waste Program Guidelines

[SPRING 2020] *Scavenging is discouraged!*

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Employee/Equipment Safety

1. 25% (45 of 178 since 2000) of Public Works accidents over the last 20 years occurred during Bulk Waste collection.
2. Common accidents:
 1. Trucks hitting objects (19)
 2. Loaders hitting objects (12)
 3. Debris falling from equipment (5)
3. Common injuries:
 1. Trips & Falls
 2. Cuts & Bruises
 3. Back & Arm Strains



Spring 2020

Citizen Infractions/Violations (263)

1. Freon filled appliances (43)
2. Tires & vehicle parts (41)
3. Paint (31)
4. Fuel, oil, propane or unknown (11)
5. Glass (22)
6. Waste leaned against pole/fence/tree (18)
7. Rocks, dirt, sod, etc. (21)
8. Construction debris (11)
9. Blocking hydrant or utility (9)
10. Illegal dumping (27)
11. Pile not in street (5)
12. Parking violation (5)
13. Unknown hazmat (3)
14. Very large piles (10)
15. Damage from rule violation (6)



Top 3 Citizen Infractions

1. Hazardous Waste (88)

Refrigerators, paint, oil, solvents,
propane tanks, etc.



2. Contractor/Landscaper Debris (11)

Construction/Landscaping debris is increasing.
Residents schedule contract work prior to Bulk
Waste Pickup and leave debris at curb.



3. Illegal Dumping (27)

Occurs in the evening on main roads. Increases risk to employees, and requires additional staff.

2. South Salt Lake	Box/Bundle/Bag
3. Midvale	Box/Bundle/Bag
4. West Valley	Box/Bundle/Bag
5. Draper	Dumpsters
6. West Jordan	Dumpsters
7. Riverton	Dumpsters
8. South Jordan	Dumpsters & Box/Bundle/Bag
9. Cottonwood Heights	use WFWRD (dumpsters)
10. Taylorsville	use WFWRD (dumpsters)
11. Herriman	use WFWRD (dumpsters)



Call-2-Haul Program (Salt Lake City)

Rules:

- Large bulky items that don't fit in waste container
- One collection per year
- Pile size limit 8' x 4' x 2'
- No more than 24 hours prior to pickup
- Pickup between 7 AM - 2 PM
- Bigger/more items, resident to haul to landfill/use private hauler.
- Enforce through education/not picking up waste.

Cost/Resources:

- No cost to resident
- City dedicates 8.5 people plus trucks & loaders (\$1.3M).



Box/Bundle/Bag Program (Midvale, S. Salt Lake, West Valley, S. Jordan)

Common Rules: (vary for different cities)

- Max. weight of 75 lbs.
- No hazardous materials, construction debris, tires
- Bundles: length of 4 to 5 feet, diameter 1.5 feet
- Max. tree limb diameter of 3 inches in bundles
- Yard waste bagged, no grass clippings

Scheduling/Costs:

- Midvale: April & October with garbage collection
- South Salt Lake: Spring & Fall with garbage collection
- West Valley: Monthly with garbage collection
- South Jordan: Pick up by appointment - \$15 fee



Dumpster Program

(Draper, W. Jordan, Riverton, S. Jordan, S. Salt Lake)

- **Dumpster Size and Cost:**

- Draper: 20 & 30 yard - \$120 & \$150. Limit 3/year.
- West Jordan: 30 yard at no cost. Limit 2/year.
- Riverton: 30 yard - \$200 April thru Nov.
- South Jordan: 15 yard - \$40/day & \$80/weekend.
- South Salt Lake: 13 yard - \$25 for 3 days.
- Sandy: 30 yard - \$140 for 3 days. Limit 2/year.
- No hazardous materials, tires, appliances w/ freon, etc.
- First come first served.
