Subject: Proposed Amendment to Section 4 of the Draft General Plan

On December 10th staff presented Section 4: Mobility of the Draft Sandy Pace of Progress General Plan to the Council.

Mobility and transportation are integral parts of our General Plan and an aspect of our community that is of great interest to our residents. It is essential that we plan for growth both within Sandy City and in surrounding communities that will undoubtedly affect our transportation network. While maintaining an appropriate level of service amid this growth is a concern, the paramount priority must be increasing the safety of all modes of transport.

As we pursue enhanced multi-modal transportation for our community, I propose we strengthen language in the general plan that reinforces our core responsibility to promote the health, safety and general welfare of our residents. We have heard consistently from residents about the importance of safe streets, sidewalks, crossings, bike paths and trails. Enhancing the safety of our transportation network will include a variety of approaches, best practices and funding sources. I am proposing to include language in the General Plan that shows our intention to pursue these outcomes.
