USAID HOVERLA ACTIVITY OVERVIEW

USAID Governance and Local Accountability (HOVERLA) Activity assists the Government of Ukraine (GOU) to progress and strengthen decentralization reform by supporting local governance institutions to become more self-reliant, accountable to citizens, and able to provide services effectively. USAID HOVERLA also assists GOU in clearly defining levels of government, respective authorities, and their responsibilities.

DAI is implementing USAID flagship local governance and decentralization support HOVERLA Activity with a period of performance through March 2027. The Activity with a main office in Kyiv and seven regional offices supports 12 oblasts and 103 communities. USAID HOVERLA aims to advance transformative changes in local governance systems. It also strives to strengthen the institutional capacity of local bodies and their leaders to implement their mandated competencies effectively.

To address the challenges of war, HOVERLA adjusted its support to assist partners with emergency response, continuation of services delivery, and reconstruction planning.

PARTNERS

USAID HOVERLA closely works with multiple GOU institutions such as the Ministry of Communities, Territories, and Infrastructure Development and the Verkhovna Rada. USAID HOVERLA also cooperates with other USAID and donor-funded projects to provide relevant and timely technical assistance.

OBJECTIVES

USAID HOVERLA assists GOU in developing a strong legal framework for local governance that provides an appropriate balance of authority and responsibility between local self-government institutions and subnational and national executives. The Activity also supports sectoral and fiscal decentralization to ensure local government accountability, effective citizen engagement, and oversight through the following three objectives:

- 01** : Ensure Ukraine's local self-governance system is increasingly institutionalized and effective.
- 02** : Facilitate more self-reliant subnational governance.
- 03** : Create mechanisms to allow citizens to play an increasingly influential role in local governance.

GOALS

1. USAID HOVERLA supports decentralization reform
 - to help Ukrainians improve their quality of everyday life
 - to make local government transparent, accountable and accessible to communities
2. USAID HOVERLA supports the local self-governance in the implementation of their new mandates and responsibilities provided by decentralization reform

4. USAID HOVERLA supports citizens of communities to increase their influence in local governance


