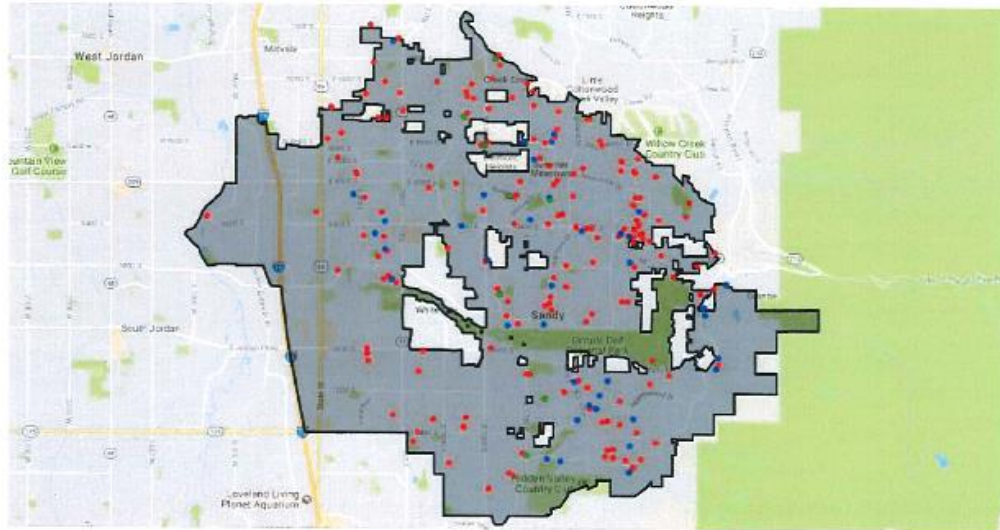


- STR's banned in late 90's
- March 2017, Rep. John Knotwell presented the Sandy City Council with proposed state legislation on STR's (HB 253)
- 2017 General Session, a "watered down" version of HB 253 passes
- March-April 2017, Cities are given a strong recommendation from Legislature regarding STR's
- April 2017, Sandy City Council begins researching STR's and writing STR ordinance
- August 2018, Sandy City adopts STR ordinance

Background and Timeline

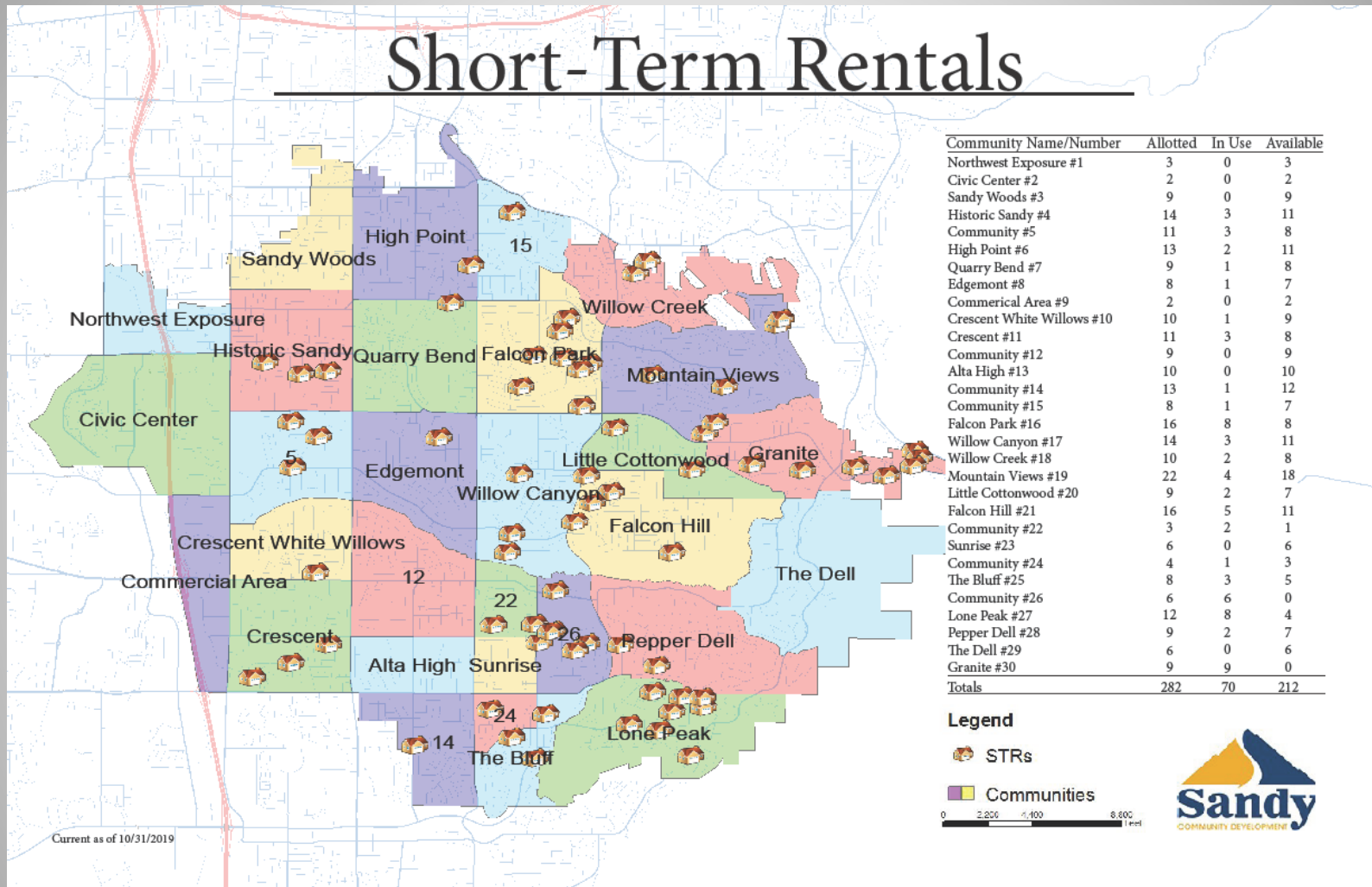
HOST COMPLIANCE

How was the cap calculated?

- The current cap is 1 STR permit for every 100 single family dwelling units in each of the Cities 30 communities, plus an additional 2 permits per community (282 permits in total)

Where are we now?

- Our STR Software has estimated that there are 270 STR's currently operating in Sandy City (15% increase since 2017)
- Our ordinance requires a biennial update to the STR cap (the first update should occur sometime in late 2020)
