

Sandy City Fire Department 2018 Budget Presentation



A number of citizens of Sandy Co. Salt Lake Co., state of Utah, met in the Sandy City Hall at 8 pm. Aug 29, 1908, for the purpose of effecting a permanent fire department organization.

Now W. W. Wilson presented the matter before the body assembled; giving an account of the necessity of a Fire-department here at Sandy. Nominations were then in order for the election of chairman, and W. B. P. Bradbury arose and nominated W. W. Wilson who was sustained.

The next in order was the appointment of a temporary secretary, the nomination by Robt. Larson resulted in the selection of Carl O. W. Pierson.

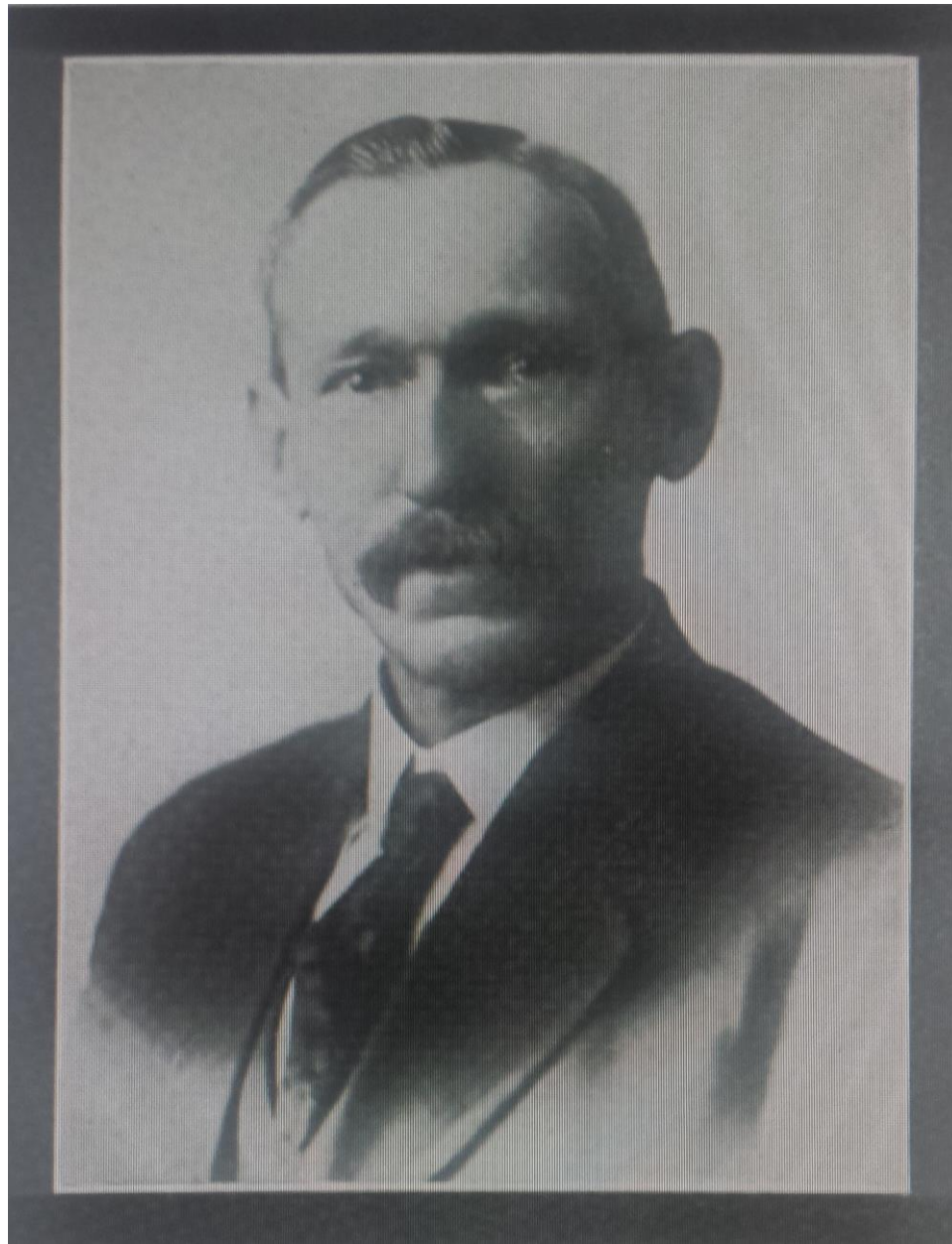
An explanation was offered by W. B. Bradbury as to the various officers in a fire department. A suggestion was then offered by W. W. Wilson, that Chief Ole Nelson should appoint his own assistants (Mr. Nelson has already been elected chief by the City Council.) Suggestions were offered in the same direction by H. Harriott and R. White.

Carl O. W. Pierson then gave an explanation on general organization. Robt. Larson then made a motion that Ole Nelson should be given till Wednesday night to select his 1st & 2nd assistants that he should have authority to select and place men in their various offices, and that each one effect the organization by signing their names to a resolution, to sustain the chief and marshall.

The resolution was then for and read by secy. Pierson as follows: "We the undersigners, citizens of Sandy Co., state of Utah, do hereby

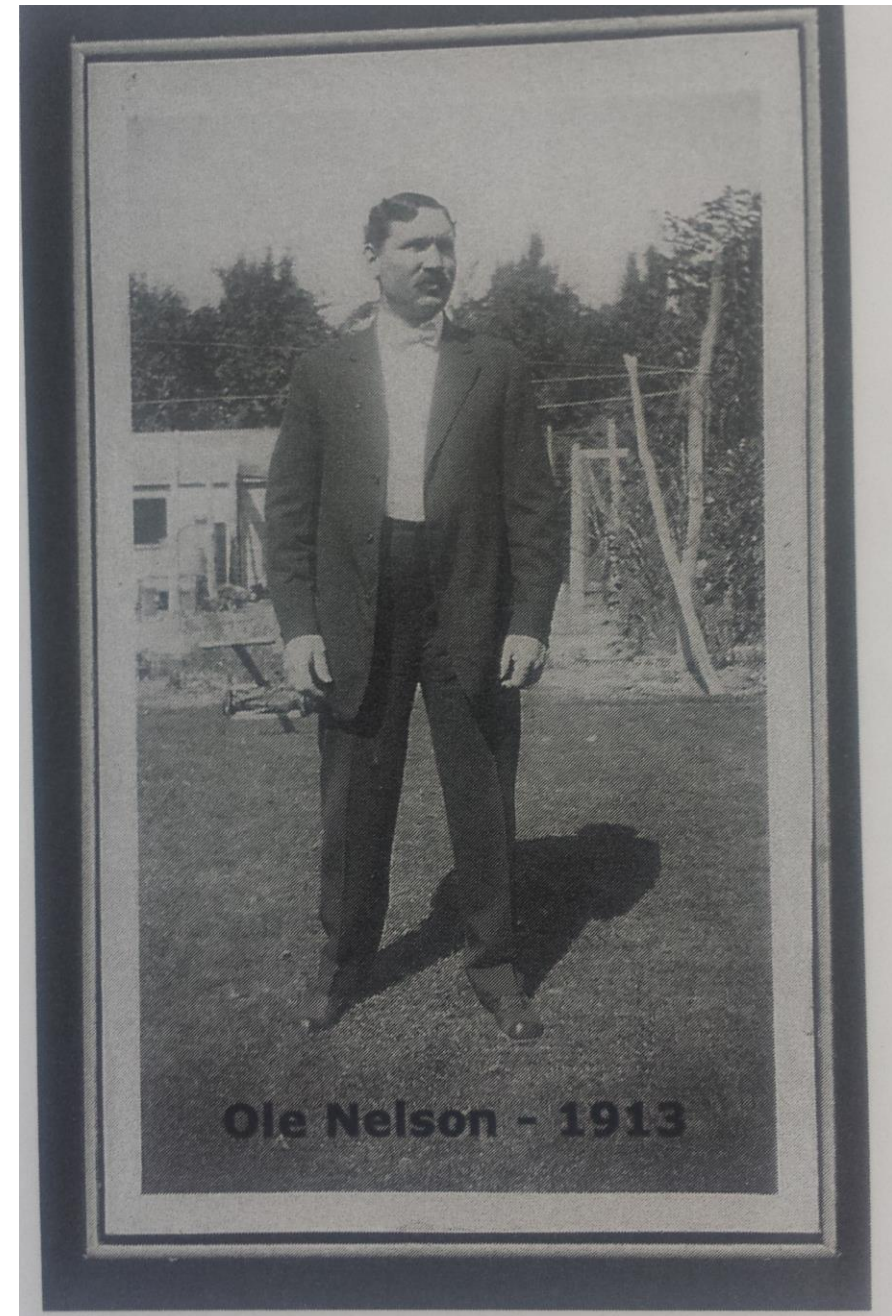

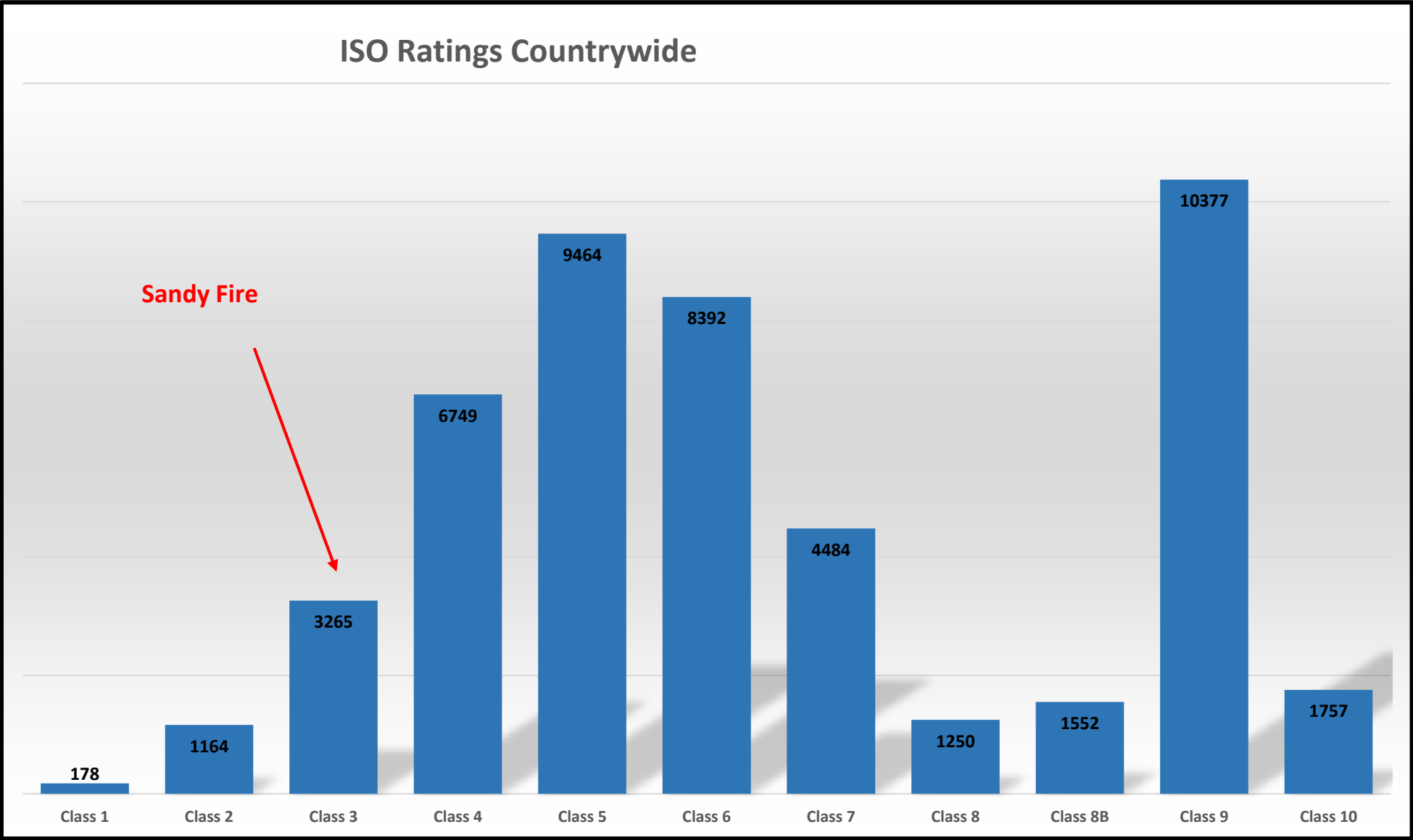

Call Volume Comparison

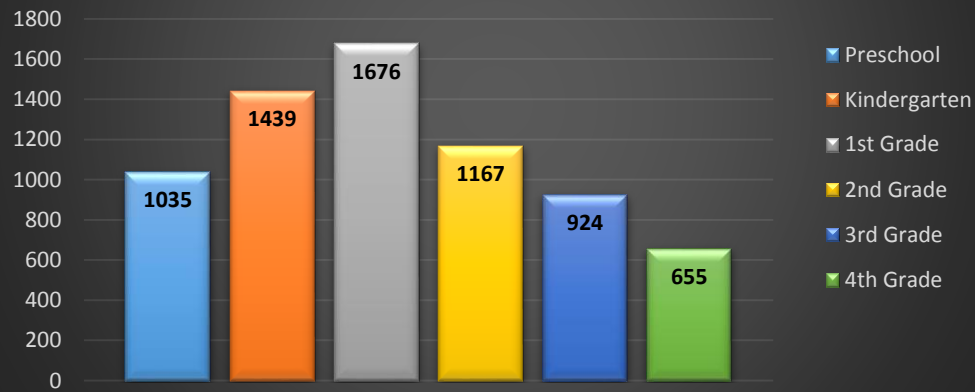


Fire Marshal's Office Activities

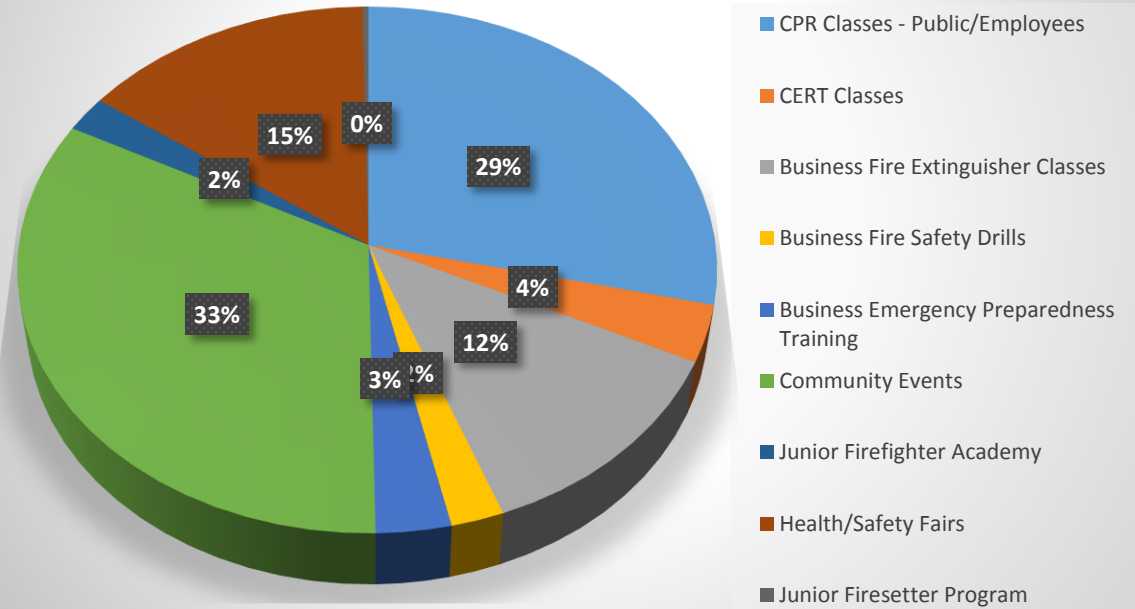

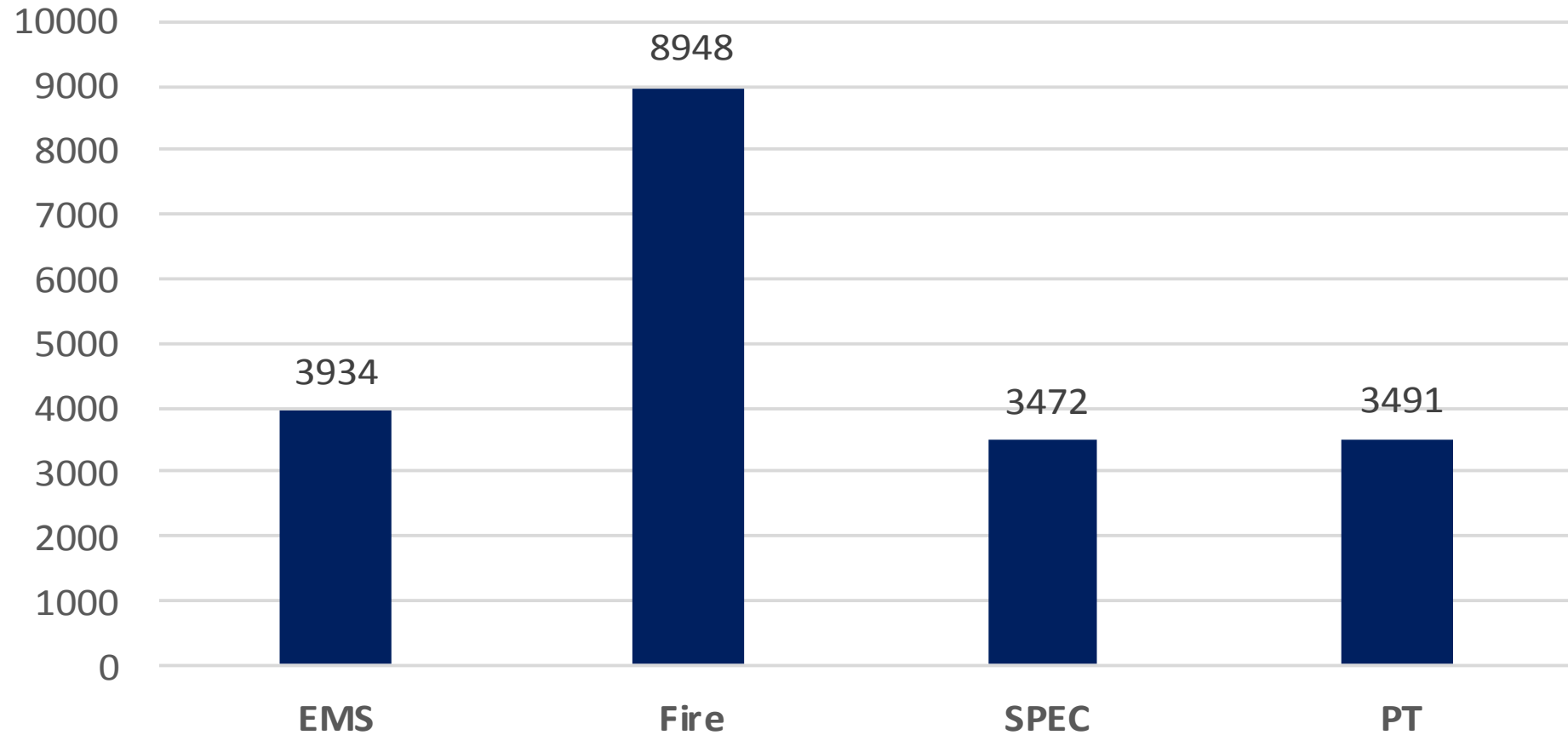
Fire Prevention School Programs 2016 (6,896 students present)



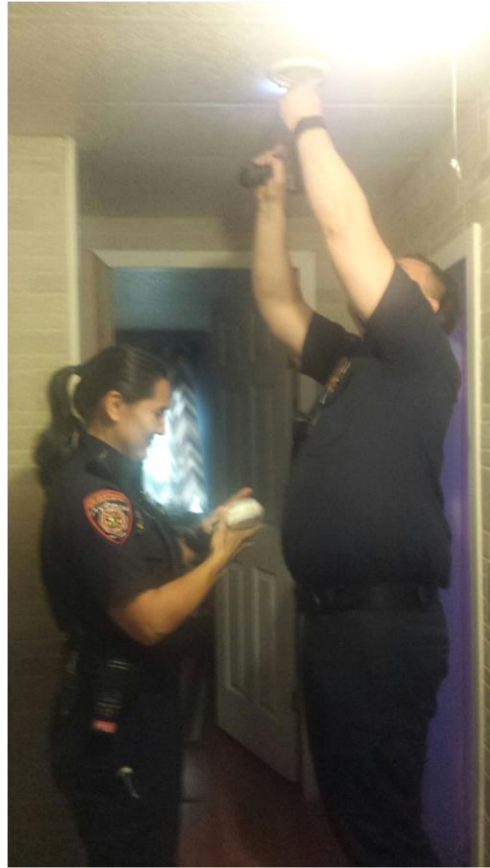
Fire and Life Safety Division Prevention Programs (2,362 present)



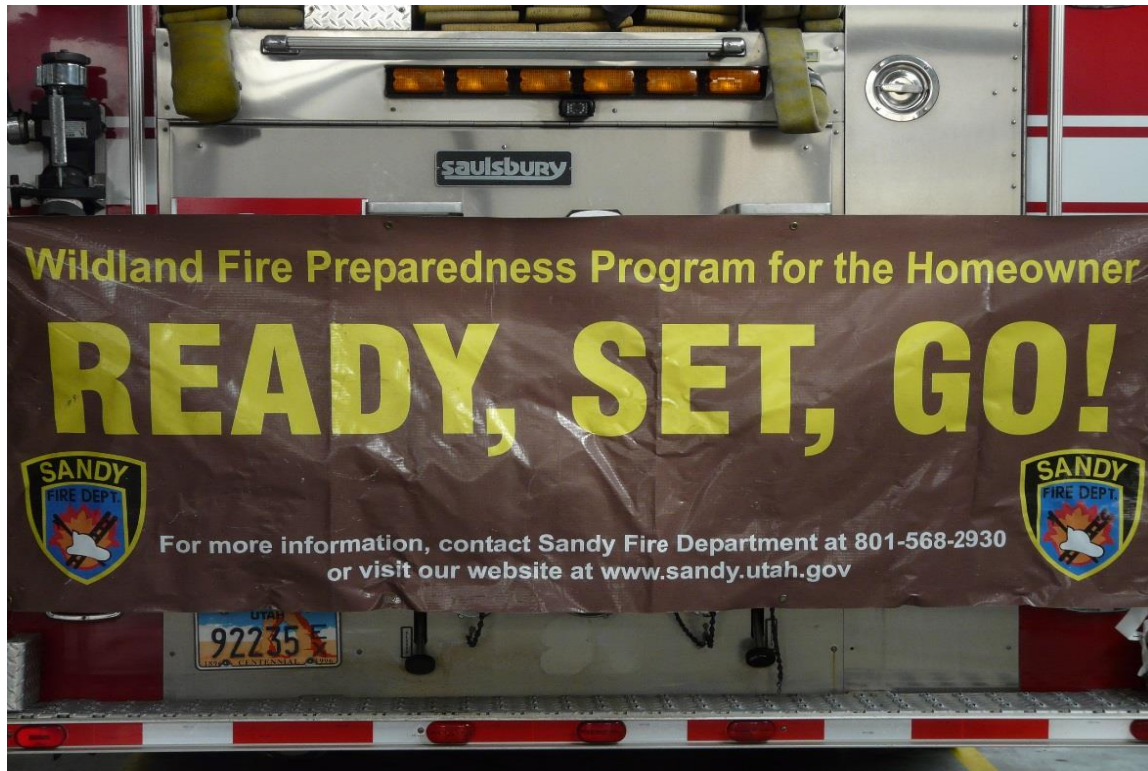
Total Training Hours 2016

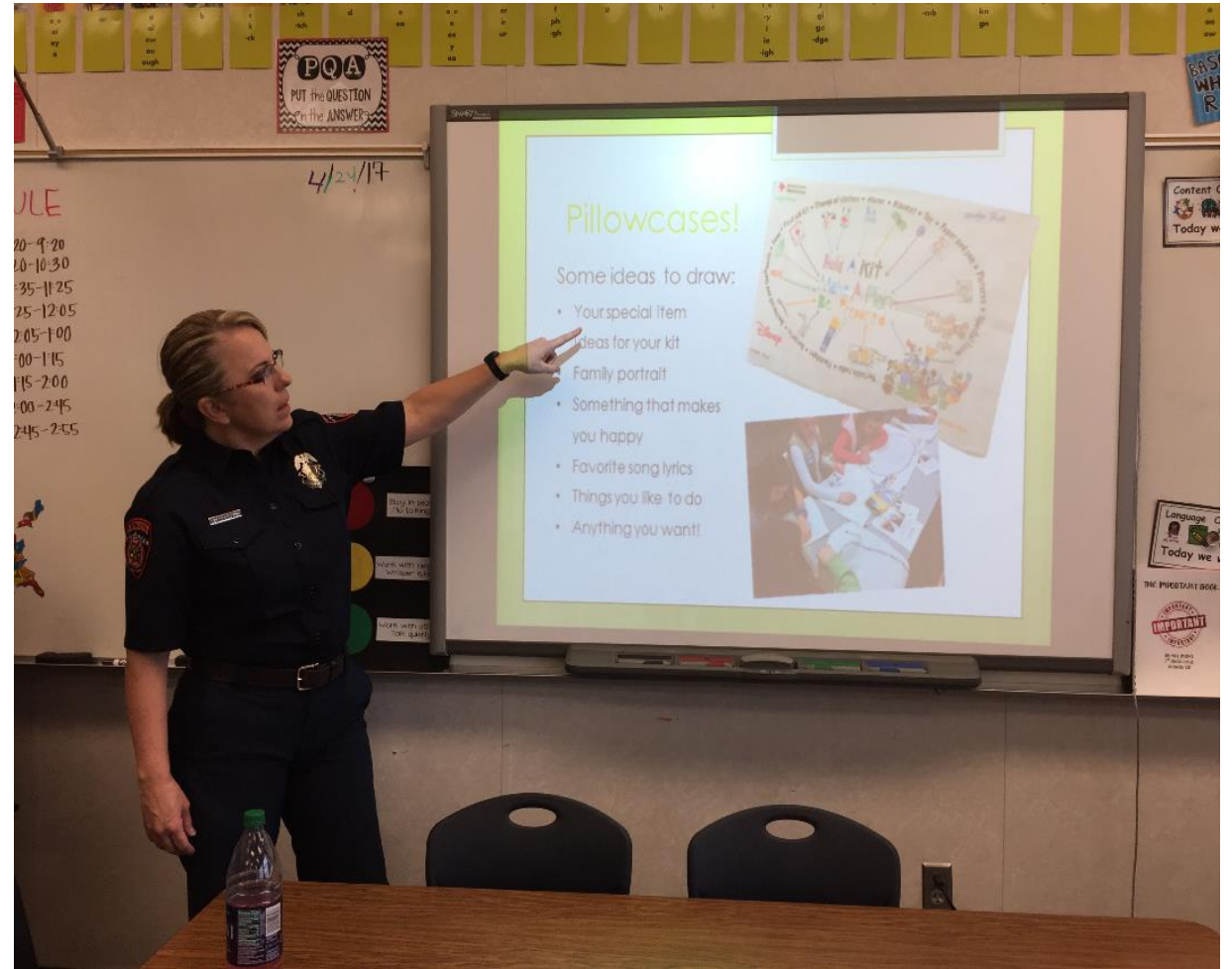
