

**SANDY CITY, UTAH
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT - FY 2016-2017
PROPOSED ACTION PLAN AND PROJECTED USE OF FUNDS**

Sandy City will submit to the Dept. Housing and Urban Development the proposed Annual Action Plan and allocation of FY 2016-2017 Community Development Block Grant Funds. The City intends to allocate approximately \$365,545 in new entitlement CDBG funds, for the 2016-2017 CDBG Program year beginning July 1, 2016. These funds come from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended. These funds are to be used for carrying out one of three broad national objectives: benefit to low and moderate income families, aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight, or meet other community development needs having a particular urgency.

PROPOSED ACTION PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT OBJECTIVES

The primary national objective of the federal CDBG Program is the development of a viable urban community by providing decent housing and a suitable living environment and by expanding local economic opportunities principally for the low and moderate income residents of the community. Sandy City receives an annual entitlement of CDBG funds to plan and promote this primary national objective. The proposed Action Plan and adopted Consolidated Plan provides information regarding low/moderate income needs, priorities and strategies to meet those needs.

PROPOSED ACTIVITY DESCRIPTIONS

Applications were sought from the community for eligible projects, with the deadline of December 4, 2015. The CDBG Citizen's Advisory Committee carefully reviewed each application, and after careful deliberation will recommend funding allocations to the City Council on April 12, 2016 during the public hearing.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

A copy of the proposed Annual Action Plan (including an estimate of low and moderate income benefit, proposed activities likely to result in displacement, and a statement of the City's displacement policy) is being furnished by making it available to the public for review, copying, and comment at the Community Development Department at City Hall (10000 Centennial Pkwy), and also at the Sandy City Web site at www.sandy.utah.gov. **The Comment Period will begin March 29, 2016 and end April 29, 2016.** Upon request persons with disabilities can receive a copy of the comprehensive Proposed Statement by mail. Special assistance is also available to visually-impaired persons desiring information on the Proposed Statement.

The intent of the consolidated plan is to promote better public participation; develop more concise and measurable priorities and needs; coordinate federal statutory requirements; use existing local planning processes in the plan; provide real assessment of performance; and encourage public/private partnerships. The Consolidated Plan is updated every five years and serves as the primary document for application for federal program funding as administered by HUD (e.g., CDBG, HOME, etc.). The Plan provides a strategy for carrying out Sandy City's HUD programs, and an action plan for assessing the performance of Sandy's program, a copy of the plan is available for your review in the Sandy City Community Development Department Room 210, Sandy City Hall, 10000 Centennial Parkway, Sandy, Utah.
