

ORDINANCE #93-9

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCES #84-53 AND #84-62
RELATING TO GUIDELINES FOR FORMATION OF SPECIAL
COMMITTEES BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF SANDY
CITY.

BE IT KNOWN AND REMEMBERED that the City Council of Sandy City wishes to amend the guidelines for formation of special committees by the Mayor and City Council of Sandy City as set forth in Ordinances #84-53 and amended in Ordinance #84-62.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Sandy City, Utah, that the guidelines for formation of special committees shall be amended to read as follows:

1. Whenever the City Council and Mayor deem it to be necessary and desirable to form a special committee, they shall do so by joint resolution. Said resolution shall state that the committee is a special committee being formed and established pursuant to this ordinance, shall state the name of the committee, and shall designate the department of the City under which the special committee shall function.

2. A special committee of the City shall may consist of seven to fifteen or more members, at the discretion of the Council and Mayor. The initial appointments shall be made having the department head of the department under which the special committee functions submit a list of potential committee members to the Mayor and City Council. The Mayor shall then appoint two people and the City Council shall appoint five people, or in cases of membership numbering fifteen persons, the Mayor shall appoint five and the Council ten individuals. The ~~seven~~ committee members selected shall meet and shall appoint a chairman, a vice chairman, and a secretary. ~~Any four members~~ A simple majority of the committee shall constitute a quorum, and actions of the committee can be made by a majority of a quorum present. The committee shall set its own meeting schedule and shall meet not less than once every three months.

3. The appointments by the City Council and the Mayor may include persons who were not included on the lists submitted by the department head and may include persons who are not residents of Sandy City.

4. With regard to committees of seven persons, ~~F~~ the term of office for two of the positions appointed by the Council shall run until noon on ~~October 15th~~ March 31st of the next even-numbered year. Thereafter, the terms for these two positions shall be for two years and shall run from noon on ~~October 15th~~ March 31st of an even-numbered year to noon on ~~October 15th~~ March 31st of the next succeeding even-numbered year.

5. The term of office for three of the positions appointed by the Council shall run until noon on ~~October 15th~~ March 31st of the next odd-numbered year. Thereafter, the

terms for these three positions shall be for two years and shall run from noon on ~~October 15th~~ March 31st of an odd-numbered year to noon on ~~October 15th~~ March 31st of the next succeeding odd-numbered year.

6. The term of office for one of the positions appointed by the Mayor shall run until noon on ~~October 15th~~ March 31st of the next odd-numbered year. Thereafter, the term for this position shall be for two years and shall run from noon on ~~October 15th~~ March 31st of an odd-numbered year to noon on ~~October 15th~~ March 31st of the next succeeding odd-numbered year.

7. The term of office for one of the positions appointed by the Mayor shall run until noon on ~~October 15th~~ March 31st of the next even-numbered year. Thereafter, the term of this position shall be for two years and shall run from noon on ~~October 15th~~ March 31st of an even-numbered year to noon on ~~October 15th~~ March 31st of the next succeeding even-numbered year.

8. For committees having memberships numbering more than seven (7) persons, appointments shall be made on a similar proportionate basis as described above.

9. An individual may serve as a member of more than one board, commission, committee or special committee of the City at the same time unless such dual service is prohibited by law or ordinance.

10. Members of special committees who are appointed by the Mayor may be removed by the Mayor at any time without cause. Members of special committees appointed by the City Council may be removed at any time by the City Council without cause. In the case of removals, unexpired terms shall be filled by the appointment process previously set forth herein.

11. A committee member may be reappointed at the end of a term of office in the manner of appointment previously set forth herein.

12. Special committees created pursuant to this ordinance shall advise the City Council regarding legislative matters, shall advise the Mayor regarding administrative matters.

13. A joint resolution creating a special committee may designate more than one department under which the committee will function. In that event, the department heads of each of the departments set forth in the resolution shall perform the duties of department heads set forth herein.


14. Any board, commission or committee of the City previously formed which is not expressly provided for under state statute may be designated as a special committee by a joint resolution passed pursuant to this ordinance.

15. All former ordinances or parts thereof conflicting or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance or of the Code hereby adopted are hereby repealed.

16. The provisions of this ordinance shall be severable; and if any provision thereof, or the application of such provision under any circumstances is held invalid, it shall not affect any other provision of this ordinance, or the application in a different circumstance.

17. This ordinance shall become effective upon its ~~passage and recording~~ publication of a summary thereof and the City Recorder is hereby directed to publish such summary as soon as practically possible.


