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

Proposed Project


1. Bell Canyon Preservation Trail Head

- 1. Property purchased: January 2018
 - 1. $\,$ 56.35% Public Utility Water funds for the purpose of water conservation and storm water protection.
 - 43.5% Salt Lake County Grant for the purpose of Trail Head for public safety canyon access.

2. Restrictions from sellers:

- 1. Must be used for Non-commercial Public Outdoor Recreation and Learning.
- 2. Possible Water Tank Site.
- 3. Life estate lease to Cal Richardson on 1.42 Acres.
- The Order of Tranquility retains 50' x 70' or 3,500 Sq. Ft Parcel off Little Cottonwood Road.
- 5. May NOT be sold or given to a non-public entity.
- 6. May NOT be used as a Park and Ride for public or private facilities.









Proposed Project

- Preliminary Concept Plan Based on Purpose of Land Purchase and Input received from A) phone calls, B) emails, C) annexation/zoning meetings:
 - 1. Parking for trail access to Bell Canyon and Bonneville Shoreline trail.
 - 2. Trails and observation points.
 - 1. Access from corner of Wasatch and Little Cottonwood Road
 - 3. Restroom facilities.
 - 4. Education of storm water cycle and water conservation.
 - Demonstration of Low Impact Development best management practices for storm water control.
 - 6. Emergency vehicle access Medical and Wildfire.
 - 7. Potential future water tank site.
 - 8. Lighting and Security concerns
 - 1. Security purposes minimum requirement is 4 Ft Candles light level Uniformity ratio 4:1
 - 2. Lights down facing to minimize light spill. Install shields as needed to control light spill.
 - 3. Security Camera in parking lots
 - 4. Park police officer patrol
 - 9. Protect existing trees along Wasatch. If disturbed replant trees.









Timeline from this point:

- 1. Tentatively scheduled for December 5, 2019 Planning Commission meeting to ask for the following:
 - 1. Preliminary Site Plan approval
 - 2. Conditional Use approval
 - 3. Special Exception on Cuts and Fills
- 2. Bid out for construction in January/February
- 3. Start construction in April 2020
- 4. Complete project August 2020
