Prayer, Pledge of Allegiance, and Introductions

Council Chair Zach Robinson welcomed those in attendance.

Council Member Zach Robinson invited the public to participate in General Citizen Comment.

Ms. Dawn Sidwell mentioned that she had a hard time hearing the report from Finance regarding the costs for the temporary air conditioning unit at Alta Canyon. She is not supportive of Alta Canyon Sports Center. People in Historic Sandy do not use the center. She is not supportive of allocating \$8.3 million to build a new center or paying \$35,000 for the temporary air conditioning unit.

Mr. Ken Bowers spoke about the need to connect and extend the north-south road through Dimple Dell to help with the traffic on other roadways.

Council Member Aaron Dekeyzer introduced John Larson, Transportation Director for Salt Lake City, who presented to the Council on the Vision Zero Safe System Approach. Vision Zero is a philosophy on how we look at our changing transportation system. The Vision Zero approach was described as follows: traffic deaths are preventable, integrate human failing in approach, prevent fatal and severe crashes, systems approach, and saving lives is not expensive. Speed is the biggest factor related to injuries and fatalities. Mr. Larson spoke about the effectiveness of designing streets to minimize traffic injuries/fatalities. He reviewed with the Council the Vision Zero Actions implemented by Salt Lake City, street and intersection typologies design guide, and transit corridor makeovers. He provided examples of projects in Salt Lake City. Council questions and comments followed. Council thanked Mr. Larson for his presentation.

Council moved to General Citizen Comment.

Ryan Kump and Britney Ward, Public Works, provided an overview of the Wasatch Front Area Comprehensive Safety Action Plan, a plan to provide local governments the means to make strategic roadway safety improvements. The Wasatch Front Regional Council is overseeing and leading the program. She reviewed the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grant program which will award \$5 billion over 5 years from FY 22 to FY 26. There are two grant types: Planning and Demonstration and Implementation. More than \$1.7 billion has been awarded in FY 2022 and FY 2023. She spoke about the Safe System Approach which is an approach to transportation system design and operation that should reduce crash severity and save lives by anticipating human mistakes and lessening impact forces. Ms. Ward reviewed a detailed safety analysis of intersections, roadway departures, speed related, and pedestrians and provided examples of case study project locations in Sandy. The program has established a goal to reduce deaths and serious injuries for all roadway users by 50% by the year 2040 and to reduce roadway fatalities and serious injuries by 2.5% each year compared to the preceding three-year rolling average. Council questions followed.

Council Member Marci Houseman was excused at 7:15 pm to attend an event at the Canyons School District..

Ryan Kump acknowledged the work that Ms. Ward has done on preparing and filing for grants. Public Works has been very successful in attaining federal grants for these projects. More funding is needed to continue work on future projects.

Chief Ryan McConaghie provided an update to the Council on Wildland deployment of city fire personnel. He introduced Battalion Chief Matt Stuebner who spoke on the deployment experience and process. He has been a part of the wildland deployment program for ten years. Members of the Sandy Fire Department are Red Card certified which is an accepted interagency certification that a person is qualified to do the required job when arriving on incident. Deployments are done through Interagency Resource Ordering Capability (IROC) and Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC). He spoke about the commitment, reimbursements, training, and benefits of participating in wildland deployments. The experience is very valuable for our firefighters and he recognized firefighters in the chambers who were back from a deployment. Mayor Zoltanski and the Council thanked the fire department for their service and for their help to other agencies in fighting wildland fires.
