On May 8, 2018 the Sandy City Council considered the imposition of the 0.25% local option general sales tax for transportation pursuant to Senate Bill 136. No action was taken on the item at that time.


The issue was brought back to the Council's June 19, 2018 agenda. I'm pleased to inform you that the Sandy City Council voted to support Salt Lake County's imposition of the 0.25% local option sales tax for 2018. The vote carried 4-3 in favor as follows:

Like other cities across the valley, Sandy City has numerous road maintenance projects, need for improved sidewalks and pedestrian options, bike lanes, connectivity with transit and additional traffic calming devices. The municipal 0.10% of the 0.25% available to cities in 2019 will enable the City to invest in these types of critical infrastructure projects for the safety and improved quality of life for Sandy City residents, businesses, and visitors.
