Re: Reappointment of Public Utilities Advisory Board Members

On December 31, 2020, two members of the Public Utilities Board terms will end. Those currently up for Council reappointment are Larry Bowler and Florence Reynolds.

The Public Utilities department respectfully recommends these two board members to be reappointed. The unique professional experience in the water and public utilities area that Florence and Larry bring to the board provides the City with balanced breadth of high level expertise that has proved invaluable as we manage the various challenges and issues presented in efficient management of our drinking water, storm water and street light utilities.

Florence is a long time Sandy resident and retired after a long and esteemed career as a recognized technical expert and manager in drinking water treatment, distribution system water quality monitoring, storm water quality, source watershed protection, well water treatment, and various other areas.

Larry is also a long time Sandy resident and retired. He brings a wealth of experience in management roles at Salt Lake County public works and at Sandy Public Utilities. He has an intimate knowledge of Sandy's challenges and successes during a time when the city successfully addressed growing pain issues including an insufficient drinking water supply, systemic flooding, and development of a new street light program.

These two individuals are extremely valuable to the board and the Public Utilities department. We have spoken to each and both have expressed interest in continuing to serve on the Public Utilities Advisory Board. We strongly recommend reappointment of Larry Bowler and Florence Reynolds to the Public Utilities Advisory Board.

Both individual's terms end December 31, 2020 and with Council support and action, would be extended to December 31, 2022.
