Partnerships

Canyons School District: We partner with schools to bring the students an outreach program. This program is designed to give elementary students the opportunity to learn about classical ballet and see portions of a live performance. 2,200 students attend

57 Dance studios: We partner with 57 dance studios and universities (BYU, U of U, & UVU) through out the Wasatch Front. These studios send their dancers to our audition each year to dance in either the Nutcracker or our spring ballet.

Dance studio owners: We collaborate with Linda Fenton Dance Studio, Utah Dance Center, Lancaster School of Ballet and Classical Ballet Conservatory. These studio owners are our artistic directors and choreographers.

Sharetix: We partner with Sharetix who has about 40 agencies they work with that serve at-risk communities along the Wasatch Front. - *Mascot Miracles Foundation: Founded in 2013, the Mascot Miracles Foundation is a non-profit organization that helps children who have serious illness through professional, college and corporate mascots; by creating and attending events, and parties; and bring smiles to those children in unthinkable situations.


