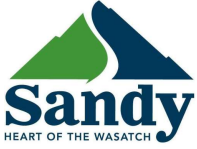

Subject: Update on Sound the Alarm, Bell Canyon Trail Markers and Senior Falls

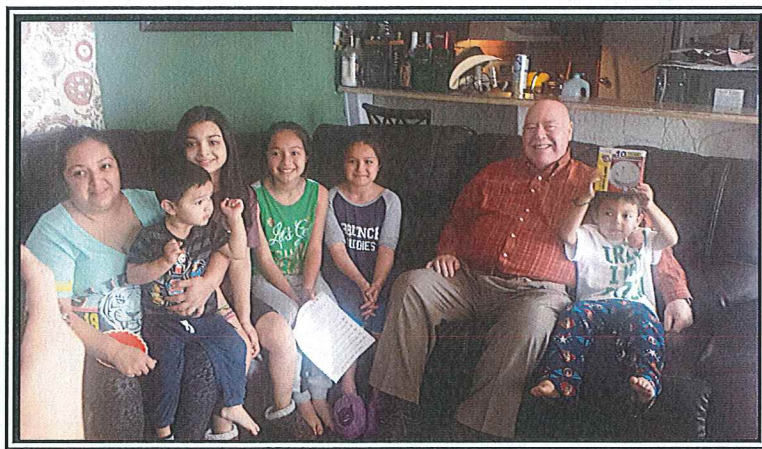
Sound the Alarm Program

The Sound the Alarm program was started on Saturday March 19, 2017 with fire crew and the Mayor visiting Sandy residents living in Sandee Village Mobile Home Park and the Hooser's Mobile Home Park. Fire crews installed 38 smoke alarms to the 108 homes that were visited.

The fire department spent the summer months visiting and offering smoke alarms to the residents of Alta View Estates, Crescentwood Village Mobile Home Park, Tinywood Village Mobile Home Park, Skyview Estates Mobile Home Park and the Crawford Place Mobile Home Park. A total of 516 homes were visited and over 400 smoke alarms have been installed or given out.

The Fire department has also installed smoke alarms in all districts throughout Sandy City.

The Red Cross has provide all of the smoke alarm at no cost to the fire department or to Sandy residents.



Bell Canyon Trail Markers

The Bell Canyon Trail Marker project kicked off early in the spring after the Mayor asked how we can make it safer for first responders and the many hikers that use the Bell Canyon Trails. This project took most of the summer to implement with the first marker being placed on September 8, 2017. The fire department had help from Parks and Recreation, Public Utilities and the great Sandy Communication Department. Healthy Sandy and Alta View Trauma Services helped provide the funding for this project. The fire department has placed a total of 20 markers in the canyon.



Senior Fall Program

The Senior Fall Program is a project close to my heart after Glades, my mother-in-law, fell and never made a complete recovery from that fall. Falls are the number one call that Sandy Fire responses on. This year the fire department was part of the Senior Fair Program at the Sandy Senior Center where I spoke about falls and fall safety. The fire department also participated in the fall program at the South Town Ranches.

Subject: Station 31 Tour and Report

Station 31 located at 9010 S 150 E is the largest fire station in Sandy City with approximately 20,000 square feet. It serves over 13,000 addresses and has responded on 1,424 out of the 4,340 calls this current year, which is 32.8% of the call volume. The response area is north to 7800 S and South to Dimple Dell Park, West to the river bottom and East to 1100 E.

It was constructed in 1984 and opened in 1985. It was built at the same time by the same contractor who built Station 32 located at 2000 E 9475 S.

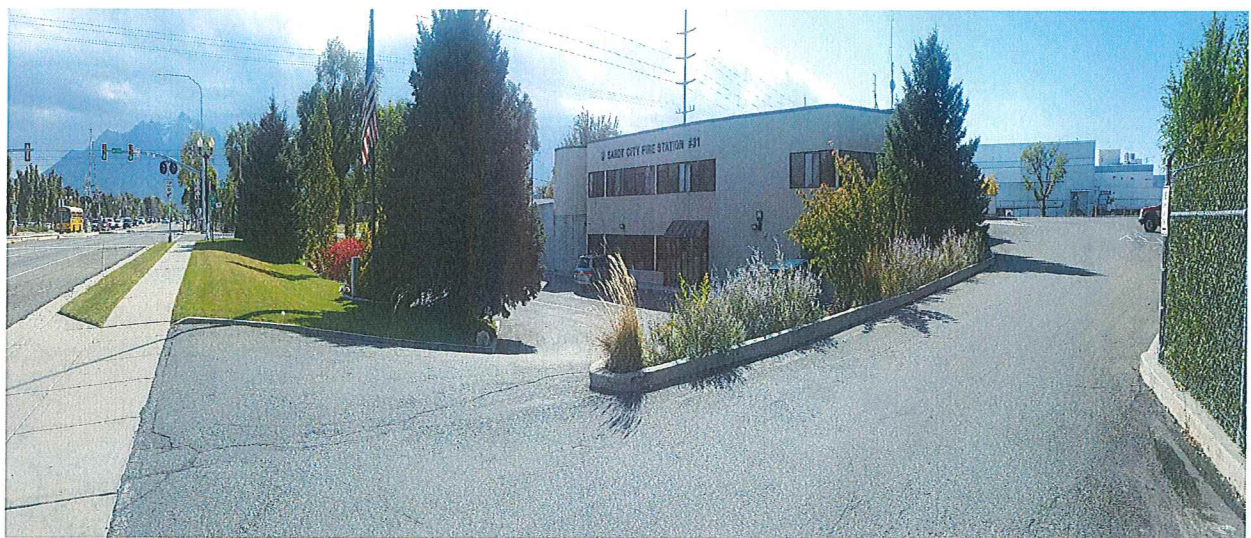
Station 31 is the administrative headquarters for the fire department. It also has a training room/community room that is used 2-3 times a week for CPR, CERT and other meetings.

The station currently houses (1) Battalion Chief, (4) firefighters along with (2) Gold Cross paramedics.

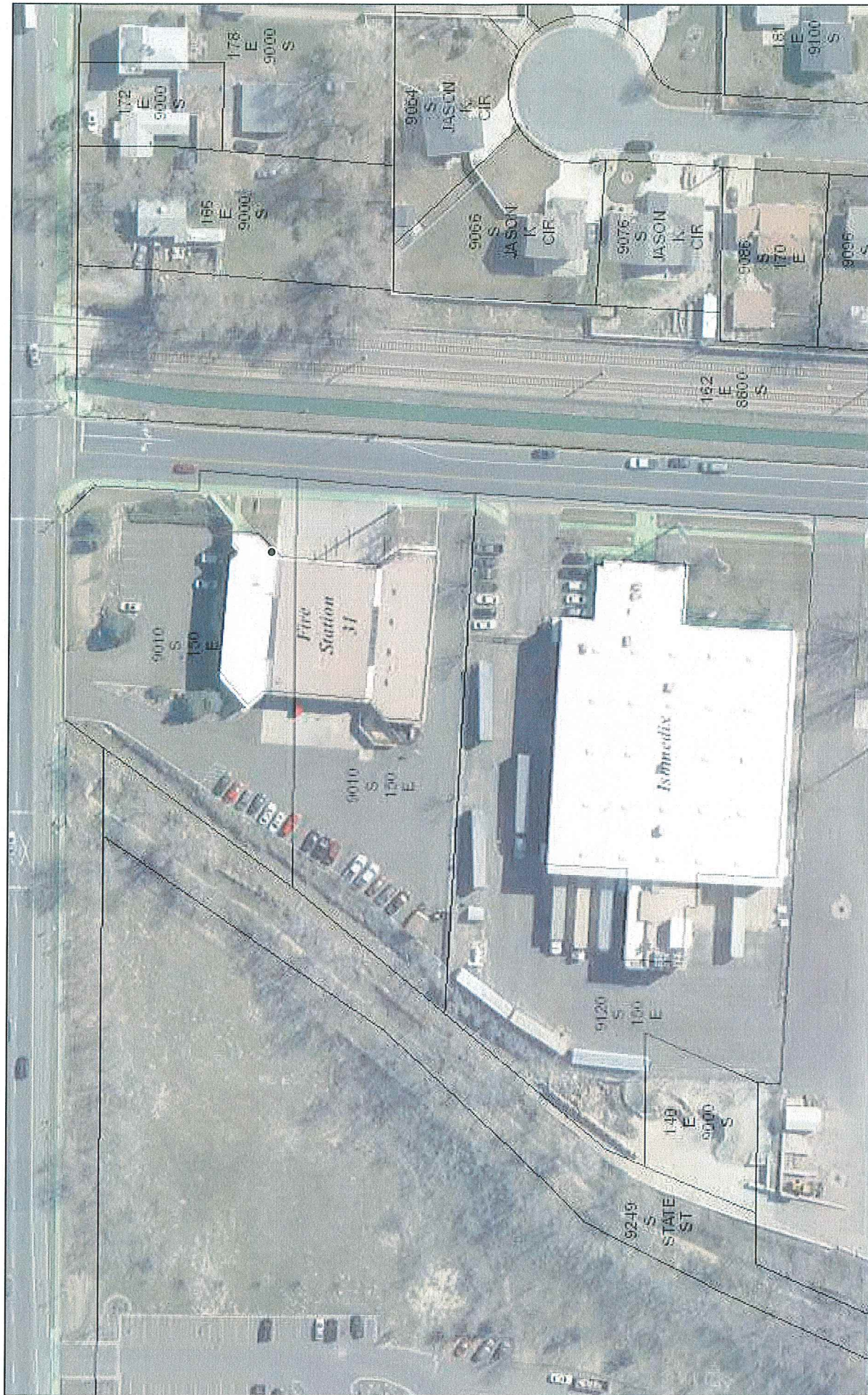
The station has 8 dorm rooms, kitchen, dayroom, men's and unisex bathrooms with showers, exercise room and storage in the basement.

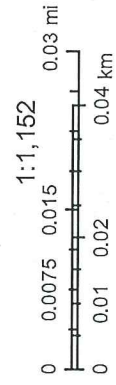
