





Current Structure




Proposed Structure

Chief,

In 2016 we released 174 cats through the TNR program. The cost of the spay/neuter and vaccinations was largely covered by CAWS and BEST FRIENDS. We were able to take advantage of their voucher program and donations. Some of these came to our door step, others I pursued in order to benefit the city and our department's budget.

These donation offset more than \$4,000 in TNR fees.

With the support of the Best Friends voucher each cat requires \$24 to treat. CAWS paid the \$24 on our shelters behalf through most of 2016. After October, the fiscal year end for Best Friends, the vouchers ran out and when reinstated, the price increased to \$31 per cat.

Based on the TNR number of 174 cats in 2016, I believe we need \$5,000 set aside for TNR costs alone. Effectively the TNR program has caused a \$5,000 increase to our budget.

Below is a complete breakdown of donated monies provided by CAWS this last year. These included TNR, but also the additional support and treatment they have rendered to the animals in shelter.
