

Sandy Pride Product, Hours, & Material

- Planted 127 Trees.
- Planted 407 Shrubs and grasses.
- Planted 370 Flats of annual flowers.
- Planted 295 Perennials.
- Installed 230 Tons of Decorative Rock.
- Delivered and spread 130 cubic yards of cedar bark and 75 cubic yards of playground wood chips.
- 27 different projects through out the City for Sandy Pride.
- Supplied 110 gal. of paint / stain and painting materials.
- 2,052 Total Service Hours.
- \$53,000 in product. Total savings to the city is estimated at \$132,500
