Project Description: Change the zoning at 590 E and 606 E 10600 S from R-1-20A to R-1-6.

Community Comments:

Concerns:

- Residents do not want this zoning to be changed. This is one of the last few remaining horse property/larger lots neighborhoods. They don't want to lose the unique feel of their neighborhood.
- 2. This will block their mountain views.
- 3. Don't want the agricultural areas taken away.
- 4. Worried about proximity of homes to their lots and their horse properties/barns.
- 5. They want to keep the zoning as is.
- 6. They feel we shouldn't spot zone this area and leave the one lot an island.
- 7. They don't want this to start a domino effect in the area for zone changes.
- 8. Traffic is a concern.
- 9. Most people moved into this neighborhood for the large lots and animal rights. Don't take that away.
- 10. They feel new home owners will inevitably complain about the horse smells and they are worried they will lose their animal rights.
- 11. Don't want a non-city standard road with no sidewalks going in.
- 12. There is a potential water line issue if they build on the lots.
- 13. They feel this is too many homes in too little space and is a fire hazard.
- 14. Don't want this zone changed to be used as an excuse to "clean up the property".
- 15. They would be okay with something going in that matches the feel of the neighborhood, but this does not and so they are opposed to this zone change.

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- 16. They feel the City should hold true to zoning so area they bought in is protected.
- 17. They are worried about their property values going down.

Other Comments:

- 1. Email received by City staff: One resident feels some development in this area might be good since a lot of the animals are gone and few want to manage a large lot. There are many weeds and old dilapidated structures that are an eyesore. He is in support of the project if:
 - a. All existing structures to be demolished and removed
 - b. A 6' masonry or precast concrete fence around the entire project
 - c. A height restriction of approximately 20' be placed on new construction.
 - d. The project has some design continuity that makes it attractive.
