Draft Kuwahara Code Amendment - Staff Proposal

Council Member Christensen introduced the process to create a new zone in Historic Sandy. The zone is specific to the Historic Sandy area and is a land use code amendment creating the Historic Sandy Neighborhood Farmer's Market zone. James Sorenson, Community Development Director, responded to Council questions. Ms. Christensen asked for feedback and recommended the staff continue the process to create this new zone.
