

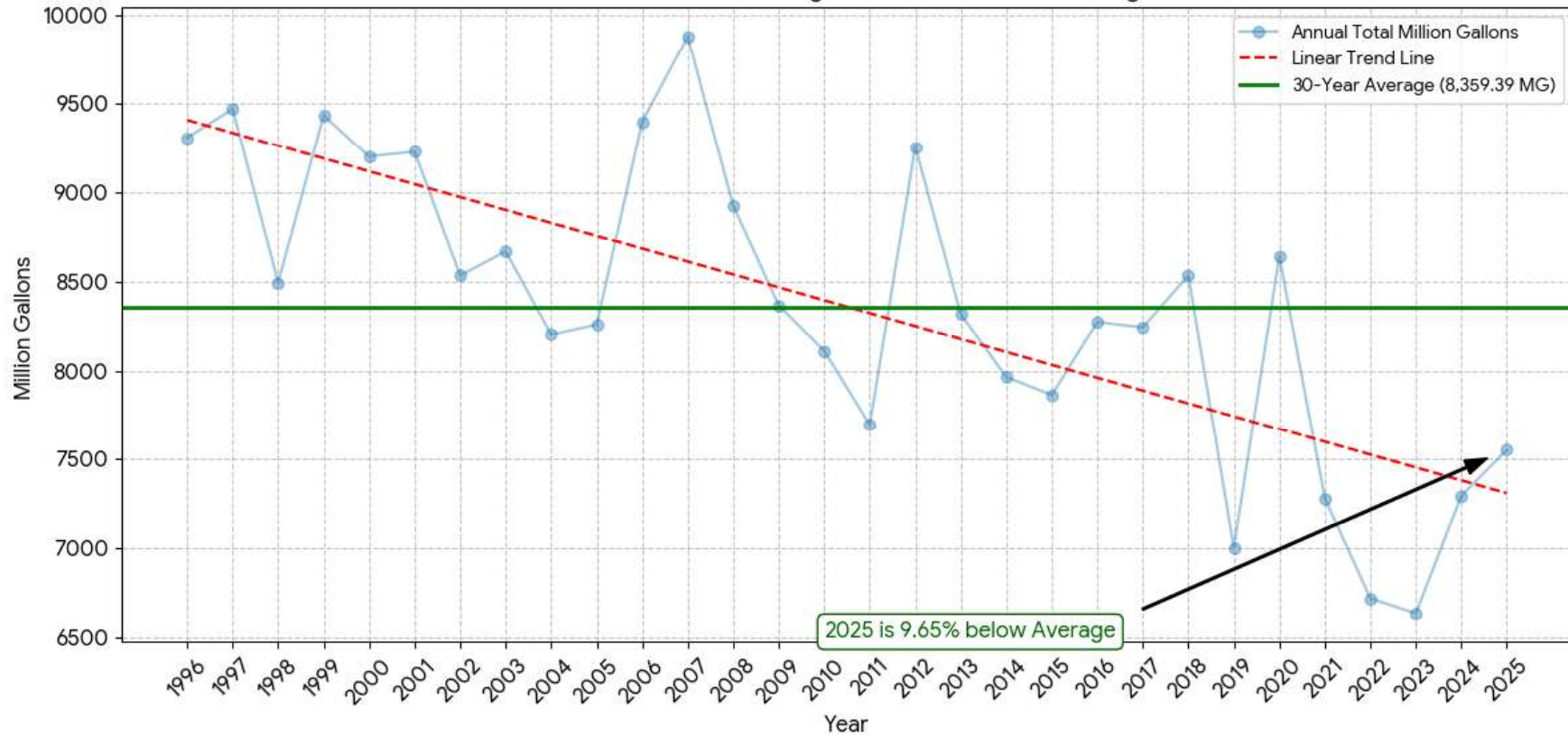

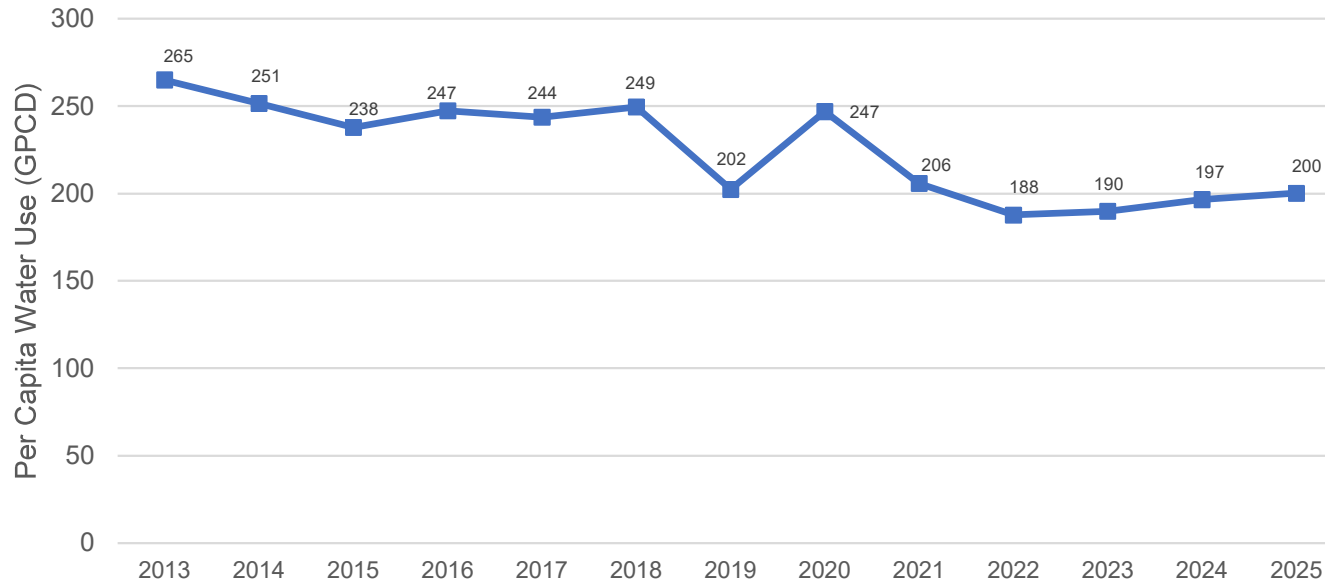
Water Use

Sandy City Gallons Per Capita per Day (GPCD)

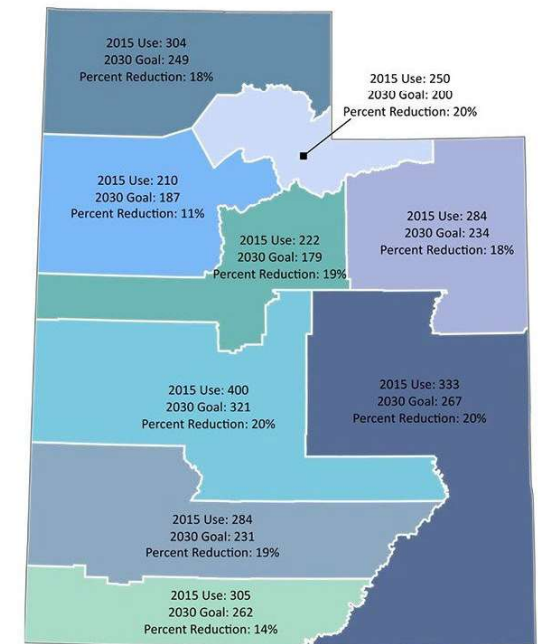

M&I Water Conservation Regions 2015 Use Vs 2030 Goals

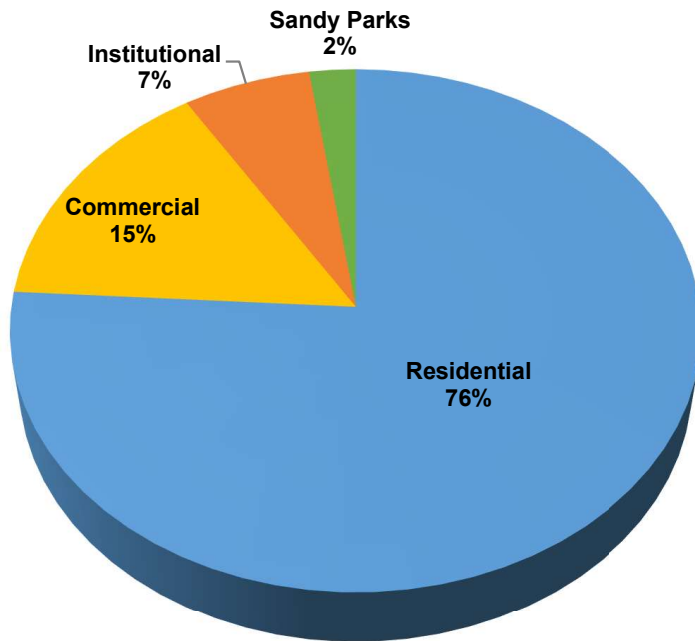

New Programs

Sego Lily Guardians

- A new pilot program we are launching this year. This is a youth program that aims to give young people the opportunity to:
 - Develop an understanding of our public water system and its impact on Utah's water cycle
 - Engage in service and outreach opportunities related to water
 - Learn and adopt practices for lifelong environmental stewardship
 - Be part of a new and unique community

Water Genius Class series with University of Utah's Osher Program

- The Osher Program is a continuing education program managed by the University of Utah. The program offers seasonal classes on a variety of topics for ages 55+. We applied to teach classes on Water Management and Infrastructure in the Great Salt Lake Watershed and have been accepted for the summer term . The class is based on Washington County Water Conservation District's "Water Genius" curriculum. Each class in the six-week series will be taught by one or more experts from the area including the Division of Water Resources, South Jordan Public Works, Central Utah, and Sandy City.

Waterwise Garden Tour – June 2026

- We are currently in the planning stages, and this is a collaborative event with Utah Water Ways (UWW) and Central Utah Water Conservancy District (CUWCD).
- We will tour waterwise yards in Sandy that residents have installed themselves or with the help of a contractor. We will select residents who have participated in the Landscape Incentive Program as they have waterwise landscaping requirements that meet our standards. The tour will encompass 4-6 stops, which will also include Sego Lily Gardens.
- UWW will collect money to ensure attendance and then will complete a waterwise project in Sandy.
