

ORDINANCE 26-40

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SANDY CITY MUNICIPAL CODE
TITLE 14 “TRAFFIC CODE”, TO ESTABLISH PARKING RESTRICTIONS
FOR RECREATIONAL VEHICLES**

WHEREAS, Sandy City is authorized to regulate the use of public streets, rights-of-way, and parking within the City in order to protect the public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, Title 14 of the Sandy City Municipal Code governs traffic regulations, and parking restrictions enforceable by the Sandy City Police Department; and

WHEREAS, regulations concerning the parking of recreational vehicles are presently addressed in Title 21, Land Development Code, and the City Council finds that corresponding provisions within Title 14 will improve clarity, consistency, and enforcement of parking regulations on public streets and rights-of-way; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that reasonable regulation of recreational vehicle parking promotes traffic safety, visibility, emergency access, neighborhood livability, and efficient use of on-street parking; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Sandy City, Utah, as follows:

Section 1. Amendment. Title 14 is hereby amended as set forth in Exhibit “A” which is attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof. All former ordinances or parts thereof conflicting or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance or of the Code hereby adopted are hereby repealed.

Section 2. Severable. If any part of this ordinance or the applications thereof to any person or circumstances shall, for any reason, be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance or the application thereof to other persons and circumstances, but shall be confined to its operation to the section, subdivision, sentence or part of the section and the persons and circumstances directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the City Council that this section would have been adopted if such invalid section, provisions, subdivision, sentence or part of a section or application had not been included.

Section 3. Effective. This ordinance shall become effective upon publication of a summary thereof.

Exhibit A

Sec. 14-7-5. - Parking or Leaving Recreational Vehicles, Campers or Boats on the Street.

It shall be unlawful to park, place, store, abandon, or otherwise leave any recreational vehicle, non-motorized vehicle or any unmounted or unattached camper, boat, boat trailer, utility trailer, camp trailer, or any other type of trailer, or any automobile hulk, on any public street, alley, sidewalk, or right-of-way at any time. For the purposes of this section, the term "recreational vehicle" shall mean a vehicular unit, other than a mobile home, primarily designed as a temporary dwelling for travel, recreational and vacation use, which is either self-propelled or is mounted on or pulled by another vehicle. In addition, boats, jet skis, snowmobiles, four-wheelers, etc., shall also be considered as recreational vehicles.
